The Stained-Glass Window! - What does it mean? Part 3 of 3 weeks of information.

The <u>Blue</u> part: The <u>theme</u> of this part of the window is that <u>God provides for His people</u>. This blue water section gives the viewer reminders of: the creation story, the story of Moses striking the rock, and the life-giving waters of baptism.

This New Part: The <u>theme</u> of this part of the window is one of <u>Resurrection</u>. The design is the backdrop to the Blessed Sacrament Altar. The images provide suggestions of: the wood of the Cross proceeding to the image of the glory of Christ's Resurrection and the light of Christ, the eucalypt tree, burnt from bushfire and the natural images of the risen sun, the light, bushfire, regrowth.

The 3rd Part (a future project): The <u>theme</u> of the final part of the window will be regrowth and re-creation. The design that exists for this section shows the greening of the burnt branches, the epicormic growth. Viewers will be able to interpret this in a spiritual way by reflecting on new beginnings after the experience of change and life challenges.

It is hoped that an 'official blessing' of the window will occur in the next few months.

Air conditioning St Finbar's Church Glenbrook

What is the need?

To provide everyone with a safe and comfortable temperature environment during the worst weeks of summer and winter. In particular, it is hoped that this provision will assist the youngest and oldest parishioners, and those with health conditions to be able to be included and participate in community despite the weather. For the general parishioner, it is hoped that more consistent comfort over the year will help with attending fully to the liturgies and prevent the distraction and discomfort from feeling too hot or very cold. The provision of air conditioning will assist the parish in providing satisfactory Work Health and Safety standards.

What factors need consideration for this decision?

Diocesan approval for any spending over \$30000:

Bishop Vincent has given his written approval for the purchase and installation of an air conditioning system.

Finance:

Ceiling air conditioning was selected over a floor warming/cooling system. The reason is cost, efficiency, effectiveness and practicality (digging up the floors for installation and limited use of the air conditioner seasonally and in hours per day).

4 quotes were obtained. The most detailed and financially reasonable quote has been selected. This favoured quote was \$66000. To date we have \$59000 available (through donations received). We will need to ask parishioners if they would be able to contribute in a small or larger way.

In summary: We may need to find an estimated \$7000 (We are not borrowing any money).

<u>Ongoing costs</u>: Most usage of the air conditioner will be in the daytime when we can directly use the electricity produced by our solar panels. The solar panels power will help to defray the running cost to a large degree. When weather dictates, it is estimated that the air conditioner would be used up to a maximum of 6 hours over Saturday and Sunday and around 1 hours on a weekday when Mass occurs.

Feasibility of achieving effective air control:

- An air conditioner unit and system are available to meet the size and design requirements of the church building.
- A contractor who works in the area of air conditioning large buildings has been selected.
- The contractor is a long-standing local company which can provide advice and back-up after the sale and installation of the system.

Aesthetic Consideration:

- The church is a unique building inside and out. It has many beautiful attributes with many based on the Australian environment as well as sound liturgical/biblical principles.
- It also houses a heritage-registered pipe organ.
- The air conditioner unit will be located on the outside of the southern front side of the building and will replace a smaller unit that already exists in that spot. The smaller unit was installed some years ago to provide comfort in (the Working Sacristy) Parents & Children room. A tall hedge already exists to screen the current air conditioner unit and will be also suitable for a new unit.
- The inflow duct (return air grill) will be located in the ceiling in the Narthex (vestibule/entrance).
- Air conditioner ceiling ducts located:
 - 1 each in the Sacristy and the Working Sacristy.
 - \diamond 2 on the northern end of the church as this is the hotter end.
 - \diamond 1 on the southern side of the church
 - 1 above the altar area but will not directly blow on the altar itself and hence will not affect candle usage.

Climate change:

Local weather is changing. We are already seeing longer, more intense episodes of hot and cold weather events. Science provides us with substantiated research about the change to the world's climates. We can power our air conditioner by solar power and therefore we are not adding the climate problem.

We thank everyone of you for making our Parish a more comfortable place for worship and prayer.
