<u>PARISH MINISTRIES</u> St Finbar's parish is blessed with the large number of ministries that exist within the parish, all run by dedicated parishioners. Some ministries are obvious when you come to Mass—these include the Wardens, Welcomers, Music, Junior and Senior Servers. However there are a lot Ministries that operate behind the scenes to keep our parish functioning including the following:

- Garden Club and Gardeners who keep the parish grounds neat and tidy and looking good
- Cashiers who count the various collections each week and prepare the money for banking.
- Hospitality people who look after food and drink after 9:30am Masses, at funerals and other parish functions
- Church Cleaners who clean and tidy the church every Friday or Saturday, ready for the weekend Masses.
- Those who launder and iron the altar cloths and purifiers used at all Masses.
- Piety Stall volunteers who man the stall at the 9:30am Mass each Sunday.
- Children's Liturgy ministers who teach the liturgy of the Mass to children during part of the 9:30am Masses
- Catechists who teach religion to catholic students in many of our local state schools.
