Closing of our Jubilee Celebrations Divine Mercy Sunday April 3 2016 All parishioners both past and present are invited to attend the 9.30am Mass on Sunday April 3.



The readings for the Sundays after Easter all provide mystagogical catechesis for the entire church, with a special emphasis for the newly baptised. This instruction is meant to help us recognise the presence of the Risen Lord in our midst. The overarching theme for the Second Sunday of Easter is the celebration of this presence in several manifestations.

While we might seek some obvious, tangible manifestation, each reading speaks of the presence of Christ in a way that we would not expect Christ to be present. He is there in the very throes of sickness, in fear and doubt, in

the celebration of the liturgy. These presences challenge us to go beneath appearances, beneath the mundane and banal of life, and there discover the risen Lord in personal mystical experience, in the ministry of the believing community, and in the transformative possibilities of the liturgy.

Experiences of the Risen Lord are not reserved for extraordinarily holy people. Any one of us can be invited into a deep personal encounter when we lest expect it, in the most unlikely places, with effects that overwhelm us. In fact, the Risen Christ is always just around the next corner, eager to enter our lives with the transforming power of the resurrection. Being part of a community of believers in prayer can be one of the most profound religious experiences. It not only transforms the present, but it also entrusts us with a vision of what is yet to be, an eschatological hope for a glorious future. *Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSS*

PARISH POTTED HISTORY 31 - Did you know?

More 60s, 70s and into the 80s - The Hughes family by Maura Williams & Geraldine Lohan

Mick and Lena Hughes moved to Blaxland East in December 1967 with their daughters Lillian (Pockran). Geraldine (Lohan), Maura (Williams) and son Gerard.

Mick was a builder who had built many homes in the Blaxland, Glenbrook area in the 60s and 70s. He was a very active member of the St Vincent de Paul Society in Penrith and when the family moved to the mountains, he joined the Glenbrook conference where he was involved in many charitable works. He would often take meals, which had been cooked by Lena, to those who needed them. He headed up the volunteer building works for homes which were destroyed by the devastating bushfires of 1968.

The family enjoyed the social aspects of St Finbar's, attending the Balls, parish dinners and social evenings. Lillian, Geraldine and Maura all settled in the Mt Riverview, Blaxland East area and their 11 children were baptised by Fr Fay in the old Church Hall. 9 those children attended St Finbar's School.

When the St Finbar's school building programme for additional classrooms by volunteer labour was commenced, Mick was one of the team leaders, spending many hours at the site.

Mick's faith was very important to him. He was a devout Catholic attending daily Mass, providing lifts to those unable to drive. When he became ill and unable to drive, he appreciated parishioners driving him to daily Mass.

Mick had developed a close friendship with Fr Danny Fay over the years and it was a long held dream of Fr Fay to build a 'proper' Church at St Finbar's. Mick had been the builder of St Nicholas of Myra Church in Penrith and he had always hoped to be involved in the building of our new Church.

Sadly Mick passed away in 1992. The Parish thought it fitting that Lena turn the first sod for our new Church which Lena felt very honoured to do. The stained glass window near the Baptismal Font was donated by Lena in Mick's memory.

Geraldine and Maura were often asked to read at Mass (in the days before the rosters) and are still involved in the liturgy ministry. Thank you Geraldine and Maura
