Gen 18:20-32; Ps 137; Col 2:12-14; Luke 11:1-13

In today's gospel, Jesus provides his disciples, and all Christians, with a model for prayer.

In keeping with this modelling by Jesus, it is significant that the Lord's Prayer, or Our Father, is the common prayer of all Christians, regardless of denomination.

The parable and teaching that follow the Lord's Prayer make clear the particular purpose of prayer that Jesus was highlighting – prayer as petition. In this instance, Jesus assures us that if we pray for what we need with conviction and confidence, then God cannot fail to respond to our prayer.

Jesus in fact encourages us to be demanding and persistent in our prayer. However, the parable used to demonstrate the persistent nature of prayer is not focused on demands for selfish purposes, but rather on the neighbour who needs

assistance in fulfilling his obligations of hospitality to a traveller.

He is not waking his neighbour in the middle of the night to ask for bread for himself; he asks for bread to give to his guest. He asks for help to fulfil his duty and responsibility. This gives us

something of an idea about how we might focus our prayer. Praying for a pony or new bike isn't quite in the same league! The final element of the gospel passage provides us with a description of God's love and care by something of a negative comparison: if human parents would not do harm instead of good to their children, God is even less likely to act like this towards us.

It's a bit of an odd way around of saying that God's love is greater than anything within our experience or imagination.

WYD NEWS FROM THE DIOCESE:

DAY THREE IN THE PHILIPPINES

Work continued for our pilgrims at schools in Panglao Island continuing to help out wherever needed.

St Augustine's Academy has been

slowly rebuilding after the devastation of the 2013 earthquake and pilgrims have been painting classrooms in the new buildings constructed after the 2013 earthquake. Across the road at Panglao Central Elementary, the pilgrims assisted with painting and maintenance around the school. At Doljo Elementary, students are helping with gardening.

Pilgrims are also helping with feeding programs



for malnourished children. At both Panglao Central Elementary and Bolod Elementary, volunteer parents visit every day and cook food

for the 30 to 40 children at each school. Pilgrims have been helping these par-

ents out with this program by cooking and serving food.

Pilgrims ended the day with a dinner. The dinner demonstrated the friendship that has developed between the two Dioceses.

In a speech to pilgrims, Bishop of Tagbilaran, the Most Rev Leonardo Y Medroso DD said pilgrims had followed the call to be merciful 'You have made known God's mercy on you and extended that gift of mercy to others,' he said.
