PROJECT COMPASSION: When Typhoon Santi destroyed her home in coastal Philippines, Aloma feared for her family's safety and their future. Extreme weather events such as typhoons and cyclones are a common occurrence in this country. threatening the safety and food security of many families.

In the Philippines, GDP per capita is around one-tenth that of Australia's, and life expectancy is around 14 years lower. Poverty is the single most important factor determining vulnerability to natural disasters, which makes communities like Aloma's particularly vulnerable.

However, confidence began to replace fear for Aloma as she began participating in the Integrated Community Development Program (ICDP) in 2011. The program, run by the Socio Pastoral Action Center Foundation Inc., is supported by Caritas Australia. It helps communities to prepare for disasters, and adopt environmentally friendly practices.

Aloma's training in disaster risk reduction empowered her to take a leadership role in her community in caring for the environment. She manages logistics during natural disasters, and encourages the families in her village to plant mangroves for land conservation.

The program also offers guidance on working together for the common good. As a result, Aloma says, "All the skills that I learned, I pass on to friends and neighbours."



GOOD FRIDAY - AT ST FINBAR'S

QUIET MEDITATION AT THE END OF THE DAY.

The traditional candlelight presentation of music of J. S. Bach, complemented by sacred readings from the Passion of Christ, will once again be held at 7.30pm on Good Friday evening in the church. The Blue Mountains Chorale conducted by Robert Ampt, will sing poignant excerpts from St. John's Passion and all will be encouraged to participate in moving congregational hymns accompanied by organ. PARISH PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING POLICY:

The Diocese of Parramatta (the Diocese) recognises that parishioners take photographs at special occasions within the Church and at other parish events. A document outlining the Diocese's guidelines for parishioners when they want to share these photographs and/or videos on social media is located in **the Narthex**.

The Diocese is aware that parishioners enjoy taking photographs and videos at parish events and subsequently wish to share them on social media. The Diocese asks for parishioners' cooperation and care concerning the use and distribution of photographs and videos of other individuals, in particular, of children which were taken at parish events.

Why do I need to take care using and distributing photographs of other individuals?

Some individuals and families have real legal and safety issues which could put individual/s at risk if an image is made public online. More generally, it is respectful of the privacy of other members of the Church community to ask permission before posting an image online.

Even if social media settings are private, it is easy for images to become public, particularly if they are tagged or shared by others.

SOLAR PANELS SAVING MONEY FOR PARISH

The solar panel installation is now working for us and saving on electricity costs for the parish. The latest bill from our electricity supplier shows a reduction of 75% compared to our last bill. This is because we are using all the energy we produce ourselves, and only calling on our supplier when our demand exceeds what we can supply (e.g. on dull wet days and at night etc.). Once again, many thanks to all who contributed to this initiative in our parish.

THE HOLY THURSDAY collections will be for the support of the clergy and Seminarians in the Missions.

GOOD FRIDAY HOLY LAND COLLECTION:

The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land will take place on Good Friday. This collection is sent to the Holy Land Commissariat to promote the missionary work of the church. The collection is also used to maintain 74 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus, many of which parishioners would have visited on various pilgrimages.

Last year Australian Catholics donated more than \$1.3 million to this cause.

You are asked to give generously again this year, and to pray that peace and harmony will become a reality in the birthplace of Jesus, the 'Prince of Peace'.
