Reflection on the Gospel

Our Gospel reads: '...not one [sparrow] falls to the ground without your Father knowing.' But that is a bad translation. The Greek simply says 'not one [sparrow] will fall to the ground without your Father.' Full stop! Our Heavenly Father accompanies a dying sparrow as it dies!

That is the measure of the Creator's love for all creatures. God wants to – does – enter into the moment of death, *our* moment of death.

Now, that *would* be consoling if I were facing what Jesus was foreseeing for his disciples in the first century.

One of the first Christian groups to hear this Gospel was that set around the Tigris River running through Baghdad in modern day Iraq. Now they face terrible persecution from fanatical Muslims. We can barely imagine hearing today's Gospel amongst the remnant, left in Baghdad today. How does 'Do not be

afraid' really sound to them?

So, we could pause for a moment to pray for those for whom today's Gospel is a challenge beyond our imagining.

DO YOU KNOW: WHY WE HAVE DIFFERENT POSTURES AT MASS?

According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, No. 43, the postures adopted by the people at after the Lamb of God. Mass are the following:

The faithful should stand from the beginning of the Entrance hymn to the end of the Collect, for the Alleluia before the Gospel, while the Gospel is proclaimed, during the profession of faith and the prayer of the faithful, from invitation (pray brethren), before the prayer over offerings until the end of the Mass except at the places indicated below.

The faithful should sit while the readings and the responsorial psalm are proclaimed and for the homily and while the preparation of the Gifts at the offertory is taking place, and as circumstances allow, they may sit or kneel while the period of Sacred Silence or the reflection song after the communion. The faithful should kneel during the consecration from the epiclesis to the mystery of faith. The faithful are to kneel after the singing of the holy, holy until after the Ephesians 3.14. Today it is a sign of profound great Amen, except when prevented on health reasons. Those who do not kneel ought to make a profound bow when the priest genuflects after the

consecration. The faithful are encouraged to kneel

The standing is a natural gesture of respect toward authority. This is why the congregation stand for the entrance, exit and proclamation of the Gospel. Standing expresses the holy freedom of God's Children. Siting is the posture of the teacher and presider thus the bishop in a Mass can sit on his chair while he teaches or preaches on the other hand it is a sign of deep listening and paying attention and that is the reason why the faithful sit while the readings are read and the homily is delivered. Kneeling is a sign of intense personal and communal prayer, as we see Jesus do it at the Garden before his arrest then we see St. Stephen do before succumbing to martyrdom. We also find Saints Peter and Paul using this Posture for ordinary prayer and meditation Acts 9.24, respect and adoration before the almighty we humble ourselves before the Lord knowing he is our Lord and Master
