### Reflection on the Gospel

When we hear the term, *yoke*, we tend to think about the yoke that is used to harness oxen together or the yoke that someone might carry on their shoulder to balance a heavy load. This yoke across the shoulder was adopted into tailoring and so the shoulder piece set into a shirt is also called a yoke. However, in the Jewish tradition there is a completely different meaning to the term.

The yoke of a rabbi was his interpretation of Torah (the Law); his teaching. Disciples who followed a rabbi sought to take on his yoke; his particular interpretation. The yoke of any rabbi was best identified by asking him, 'Which is the greatest commandment?' A rabbi's answer to this question revealed his interpretation of Torah. When Jesus is asked that question, he answers, 'Love God and love your neighbour,' and goes on to say that all the rest of the Law and the prophets flows on from these two commandments.



This is the yoke – the interpretation of Torah – that Jesus taught.

In today's gospel, Jesus calls to him all those who labour and are overburdened. It is the Pharisaic interpretation of the Law that burdens these people.

Trying to maintain the Law was burdensome and complicated for the everyday person. Jesus says, 'Shoulder *my* 

yoke and learn from me because my yoke is easy.' The yoke of Jesus *was* easy: Love God and love your neighbour.

Compared to the 613 *mitzvot* (commands) set out in the Torah and strictly maintained by the Pharisees, the yoke of Jesus was incredibly easy to understand and adopt. So simple, in fact, that it required a child-like simplicity to accept this yoke.

#### DO YOU KNOW: THE MEANING OF THE PREFACE OF THE MASS?

Traditionally the Eucharistic Prayer is divided into the people's part and priest's part. The Preface is a central part of the Mass and the first half of the Eucharistic Prayer. For many years the Preface was sung so the people could hear, while the priest's prayers were silent. Pope Pius X encouraged the people to follow the priest's prayers too. The Preface is meant to rouse us while we stand, just before normally we kneel for the priest's prayers. The word Praefatio simply means "The Prayer" speaking in front of the face of God. It begins with "lift up your heart" and the people respond "we lift them up to the Lord". The Preface may change from day to day, but always has 3 parts. The first part of this prayer always begins "it is truly right and just to give thanks to the Lord". This is the heart of our relationship with God. Giving thanks is the true meaning of Eucharist. Then the middle part of the prayer lists some of the reasons why it is truly just

and right to give thanks. It is right to thank him for he has given us saints, for the blood of the martyrs, for his marvellous works of creation and for redeeming us. Then the last part of the prayer always begins with "and so, or therefore, or since He has done these wonderful things, therefore we join the angels in praise". This section introduces the Holy, Holy, Holy (The Sanctus). The Holy, Holy, Holy part of the Preface is a song of praise and this song of the angels is joined by that of the crowd at Jesus' entry to Jerusalem "blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord". There we see the praising song of angels joins the human praise. Thus the whole universe is giving thanks and praise to God. Heaven and earth are full of his glory; we give him glory and thank him for his creation and his incarnation, for making the heavens then for coming to Jerusalem. The Preface also explains what follows in the Eucharistic Prayer.
