Reflection on the Gospel

Today we hear how the Spirit of God dwells in all of us, helping us in our weakness. The first disciples had Jesus to explain the parables; we have the Spirit to enlighten us. It is the Spirit who helps us to interpret the teaching of Jesus and to be receptive to the challenges that they pose.

The presence of sinners in the kingdom of God is often a stumbling block to good people. There will be a time for separation and judgment, but the time is not now. This

means that the righteous will have to live with the sinner and, even more challengingly, show them the same kind of concern that they show to others. The presence of sinners does not necessarily erode the quality of the kingdom. Rather, it provides disciples an opportunity to rise to the oc-



casion of generosity and forgiveness. There are two images of judgment in the readings. The one in the gospel is terrifying and decisive.

The wicked are bound together into bundles and readied for burning. We must remember that this is a parable. In the first reading and in the Psalm response the justice of God is said to be lenient, clement and kind. The power of God is demonstrated not in retribution but in mercy. God is said to be 'merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in kindness and fidelity', and

repentance is a very real possibility. This is the image that gives us hope.

<u>DO YOU KNOW:</u> THE PART OF THE MASS THAT FOLLOWS THE EPICLESIS OR THE INVOLVING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The part of the Eucharist that follows the Epiclesis is the Consecration. It is the part of the mass where the priest prays the Lord's words of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Through this prayer the bread and wine become the risen Body and Blood of Jesus. It is the retelling of what Jesus did and said when he offered his Body and Blood under the species of bread and wine, gave them to his Apostles to eat and drink and left them the command to continue this same mystery.

Anamnesis or the memorial acclamation.

They were common in ancient Eastern Liturgies like the Syriac Orthodox Church, Syrian Catholic Church, Syro-Malabar Rite, Malankara Catholic Church, Maronite Rite, Melkite Rite and other

Catholic Churches of Byzantine Rite. The Priest says or sings "The Mystery of Faith", and the people Respond, "We proclaim your death, O Lord and Profess your resurrection until you come again" or "When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup we proclaim your death O Lord until you come again", or "Save us Saviour of the world for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free".

The Word Anamnesis means "remembrance". We remember Jesus' historical Saving deeds in Liturgical action of the church, which inspires thanksgiving and praise. Every Eucharistic prayer contains a memorial in which the church calls to mind the passion resurrection and glorious return of Jesus Christ.
