### Reflection on the Gospel

Jesus takes his most trusted disciples up a high mountain to allow them to share in what he knows is about to occur. It is a very clear teaching moment in which Jesus hopes the disciples are going to finally grasp the truth about him. As the disciples stand by, Jesus is transformed before them – suddenly bathed in light and his clothes become dazzlingly white. The disciples also see Moses and Elijah standing and talking with Jesus. Moses was the great Law-giver of Jewish tradition and Elijah the great prophet. Together, they represent the Law and the Prophets – the combined wisdom that make up the tradition of Jewish teaching and Jewish scripture. It is the Law and the Prophets that Jesus' life and ministry brings to fulfilment. It is fitting that Moses and Elijah appear beside Jesus, as the three figures combined represent the fullness of Jewish tradition – the Law of

Moses; the challenge and promise of the Prophets; and the compassion of Jesus that completes the other two. Sadly, the disciples don't really get the point of what they see before them. Peter, caught up in the moment, wants to build tents on the spot to mark the moment and to continue to dwell in the moment. Jesus, however, leads them back down the mountain – back into the valley; back into the reality of life; back into the tragedy that he knows lies before them. No matter how powerful a religious experience may be, Jesus

shows us that we always have to return to real life. It is not possible to remain on the 'mountaintop' as Peter would have liked to do; we have to take the experience back into the everyday of our lives.



#### **DO YOU KNOW: ABOUT COMMUNION RITE**

After the Eucharistic prayer we begin our preparation for the Holy Communion. It begins with the Lord's prayer, (The Our Father) and it is followed by a prayer to protect us from evil. We ask the Lord to deliver us from every evil. This prayer is followed by a prayer for peace. During the Eucharistic prayer we ask the Holy Spirit to come upon us to make us one. As a sign of that oneness and to prepare for receiving Jesus in Holy Communion we offer each other a sign of peace. Since all of us have sinned in one way or other and unworthy to receive Jesus in Holy Communion, again we ask Jesus for his mercy by praying the prayer, Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world have mercy on us and then grant us peace. While this prayer is said by the congregation, the priest

breaks the bread. It symbolises the death of Jesus. Then he mingles the host in the chalice which symbolises Jesus descending to the dead to free souls. Then he joins the host again and it symbolises the Resurrection of Christ. Then the priest shows the host to the people and invites them to humbly confess their unworthiness with the prayer of the centurion who placed all his trust in the Lord (Mat 8:8). Then people come in procession to receive Holy Communion which reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage in this life, we are on a journey to our Father in heaven. Then in the prayer after Holy Communion, the priest asks God that the mystery celebrated may have an effect on our lives.

On behalf of the Parish Finance Committee I would like to thank you first of all for looking after our parish financially for many years. I thank you all for your generosity and support. This year, because of your generosity we have been able to divert some funding towards parish ministries, the sacramental program, family ministry, teaching of Scripture in public schools, youth development and the liturgical needs of the parish. Due to the selfless contributions of some parishioners, we were able to install solar panels over our parish hall roof to promote the care of the environment and clean energy and also to save the parish about \$2500 per year. We were also able to do some minor repairs to the roof to stop some leaks, and to replace a damaged section of ceiling. We have widened the parish kitchen to accommodate the growing needs of the parish, the school, and those parish groups who use the hall. We have carefully managed the parish finances and made significant savings, and so we have been able to reduce our overall parish debt from \$515,000 to \$245,000 over the past two years or so, but we need to continue this work to gradually eliminate the debt. What about the future? As soon as we are financially capable, we intend to do the following:

- Pay off all our remaining loan so the parish will be debt free.
- Install solar batteries to connect to our existing solar panels to make full use of the clean energy we are producing and to reduce our reliance on the electricity grid
- We dream of installing centralised air conditioning to make our church more conducive to prayer in both summer and winter.
- We wish to repolish and revarnish parts of our church ceiling to protect it from the elements.
- We want to maintain our beautiful pipe organ in good working order
- We hope to install an industrial dishwasher in the hall kitchen to lighten the load of those parishioners who look after our hospitality needs, especially at the bigger events such as funerals, and other school and parish special events.
- We are a welcoming parish and we want to organise more activities for all parishioners that will enhance their faith formation, and especially we want to involve the youth and young families.

Unfortunately the cost of everything continues to rise and the parish is not immune. We depend on the income from our weekly envelopes and monthly credit card and direct debit donations to fund our parish activities. A number of our very generous elderly parishioners have either passed away or moved to nursing homes and can no longer contribute, or have retired and have had to cease or reduce their contributions. This leaves a shortfall in our income and so we request that all families become regular donors. Please complete the form on the Wardens' table to commence regular giving through weekly envelopes, or through monthly credit card or direct debit deductions. If you already contribute regularly, can you look at the possibility of increasing your contribution (remember a cup of coffee these day costs close to \$5), and this can also be done by completing the form on the Wardens' table. it is the contribution of each one of us that enables our parish to survive and grow - however large or small, each is important. A cheerful giver is the pride of every community. Thank you for your support. Thank you for listening and especially for acting on it. God bless each cheerful giver.
