## Reflection on the Gospel

The gospel does not say that Jesus will gallantly step forward, take suffering upon himself, and thus demonstrate his power. Instead, his fate will be a demonstration of his vulnerability. He will be taken forcibly and will suffer at the hands of others. He will do this willingly, but not as a volunteer. Jesus will be a victim. This picture of Jesus carries implications for discipleship. Whoever follows him must follow him to the cross. If we participate in his success, we must also share in his shame. Disciples have a choice to follow or not to follow, but if they choose in his favour they must be ready for suffering and humiliation. Paul exhorts us to reject the standards of the world. This is a very difficult path to follow, especially when it seems that those who conform to this age prosper. Following Christ can place barriers between ourselves and others. If we no longer share their values and their interests, we may feel alienated. Suffering is bound to invade our ministerial lives as well. We must remember that Jesus' message antagonised many people in his day. Those who proclaim the same message in their own contexts must be prepared for a

similar reaction. After witnessing the marvellous feats that Jesus accomplished, we discover that he is going to suffer and be put to death. How can this be? With Peter we protest. With Jeremiah we wonder: Have we been duped? The realisation that we too will have to suffer becomes a crucial test of our faith.

### DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE DIFFERENT RITES WHITHIN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Many people may have never heard of the different Rites within the Catholic Church. Today I would like to explain what a Rite means. A Rite represents a Church tradition about how the sacraments are to be celebrated. As the early Church grew and spread, it celebrated the Sacraments as would be best understood and received in the context of individual cultures without ever changing their essential form and matter. The early Church sought to evangelise in the major cultural centres of the first centuries A.D. These centres were Rome, Antioch (Syria) and Alexandria (Egypt). All the Rites in use today evolved from the Liturgical practices and church organization used by the churches in these cities. The Church of Jesus represented in these ecclesiastical traditions is known as a ritual church. The Church in a certain territory is known as a particular church. In the Catholic Church all these Rites are of equal dignity, and have the same obligations although the particular churches possess their own hierarchy, differ in liturgical and ecclesiastical discipline and posses their own spiritual heritage. They are all under the same governance of the Pope. There are 23 different Rites in the Catholic Church. It is important for us to look at the main ones, so that we have a better understanding of the Catholic Church.

The Latin Rite: As the Bishop of Rome and the Vicar of the Universal Church the Pope is the head of the Latin Rite or Roman Rite. This is the Largest Rite in the Church. It was started around 42 A.D. by St. Peter in

Rome. As Vicar of the Universal Church, the Pope is also Vicar of other Rites as well. All these Rites have equal dignity. The Eastern Rites have a separate code of Canon Law. All of these Eastern Ritual Churches come under the Jurisdiction of the Pope through the congregation for the Oriental Churches, one of the offices of Roman Curia. The Rites are administered by either a Patriarch, or a major Archbishop. The Patriarchs or Major Archbishops are elected by a Synod of Bishops of their Rite but approved by the Pope before they take office.

Byzantine Rite: It is the largest of the Eastern Rites. The Liturgy used by the Byzantine Rite is based on liturgy developed by St. James for the Antiochian Church and modified by St. Basil. This Liturgy is similar to the Liturgy of the Orthodox Churches. The Albanian, Belarussian, Bulgarian, Croatian, Greek, Hungarian, Halo-Albanian, Melkite, Romanian, Russian, Ruthenian, Slovak and Ukrainian Churches use the Byzantine Liturgy.

Alexandrian Rite: The Liturgy used by the Church in Alexandria in Egypt is attributed to St. Mark the Evangelist. This Church became known as the Coptic Church because Copt is the Arabic and Greek word for Egyptian. Today there exists in Egypt the Coptic Rite which is loyal to the Pope and another group which is Orthodox. The Ge'ez Rite is closely associated with the Coptic Rite. Look forward to learn more about the other Rites in next week's Barra.
