Reflection on the Gospel

A distinctive feature of the teachings of Jesus is his exhortation to forgive. Very explicit about this, Jesus left us his own example by forgiving his executioners while he hung dying on the cross. Until recently we thought that forgiveness begins with the offender repenting of the offence and then asking for pardon. Today many maintain that reconciliation must begin with the one offended offering forgiveness. This willingness to forgive transforms a victim into a survivor. Such magnanimity might then touch the heart of the offender, who may thus be transformed from being an offender to becoming a friend.

If God has been so generous in forgiving us, surely we should be generous in forgiving others. The process of becoming a forgiving person takes time. For some, it may take a lifetime. Only little by little are our pettiness

and indignation reduced and our desire to strike back diminished. Still, as disciples, we are expected to give the forgiveness that we have been given.

Such forgiveness does not provide an easy way out for offenders, for ultimately justice will prevail. If we remain untransformed by God's forgiveness of us, we will be liable to judgment. Our unwillingness to forgive can eat away at us, and we can carry hurts from

childhood far into adult years. Forgiving others, as difficult as that may be, is in the long run much easier than bearing the weight of resentfulness, vindictiveness and unresolved frustration. When we forgive we truly begin to be healed

DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE CATHOLIC ECUMENICAL COUNCILS

Ecumenical Councils are assemblies of Patriarchs. Cardinals, Presiding Bishops, Abbots and heads of male religious orders and other Juridical Persons, nominated by the Pope. The purpose of an Ecumenical Council is to 4. define doctrine, reaffirm truths of faith and extirpate heresy. Council decisions need to be approved by the Pope to be valid. The participation is limited to these persons who cannot delegate their voting rights. Ecumenical Councils are different from Provincial Councils or Regional Councils. The Regional or Provincial Councils meet together. Episcopal Conferences and Plenary Councils are other bodies. Then we have meetings of Bishops of one Country, Nation or Region such as the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference. Here the term Ecumenical does not refer to all the Christian Churches but it refers to Solemn 16. Congregations of the Catholic Bishops of the World at the invitation of the Pope to decide on matters of the church with him. In the history of church there were 21 main Councils. They are:-

- 2. First Council of Constantinople
- 3. Council of Ephesus
- 4. Council of Chalcedon
- 5. Second Council of Constantinople
- 6. Third Council of Constantinople
- 7. Second Council of Nicaea
- 8. Fourth Council of Constantinople
- 9. First Council of Lateran
- 10. Second Council of Lateran
- 11. Third Council of Lateran
- 12. Fourth Council of Lateran.
- 13. First Council of Lyon
- 14. Second Council of Lyon
- 15. Council of Vienne
- 16. Council of Constance
- 17. Council of Basel, Ferrara and Florence
- 18. Fifth Council of Lateran
- 19. Council of Trent
- 20. First Vatican Council
- 21. Second Vatican Council
