THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

You may have noticed over the last couple of weeks that the Blessed Sacrament is NOT currently reserved in the tabernacle adjacent to the altar. You might also have noticed that the light is off and the veil is missing from the tabernacle. The reason is because there is a mechanical problem with the tabernacle mechanism meaning it cannot be closed or locked. This is being addressed. The Blessed Sacrament IS reserved in the tabernacle within the sacristy, where the light is on and the tabernacle veil is in place. As soon as practicable the Blessed Sacrament will be returned to the tabernacle adjacent to the altar.

St Finbar's Glenbrook, Finance Committee Meeting Report for 19.3.19

The Parish Finance Committee met on Tuesday 19th of March. It was decided to share with our parishioners the impact of your valuable financial contributions and how it has assisted in reducing the parish debt. Below is a detailed summary of where your contributions are used and how our debt has been reduced by some 60% in the past 5 years or so. Other items of discussion included:

The parish has completed the revaluing of the parish assets which includes the land, buildings and the organ. The completion and payment for the wonderful stained-glass window.

Ideas to moderate any extreme hot/cold conditions in the church, which may include air conditioning.

Provision of a maintenance program for our assets and also about centralizing all information about the physical infrastructure including all aspects of the buildings, including internet, electricity, ga, and water provision.

Investigating the creation of a small columbarium within the prayer walk at the rear of the church.

Some Finance Facts for St Finbar's Glenbrook as at March 2019

Our Income:

Sunday's First Collection: goes entirely to the Diocese to be shared across all parishes to assist the living expenses of priests.

Therefore, some money is returned to St Finbar's to assist funding of living expenses of the parish priest, apart from his car and phone/internet usage. The parish funds the difference. Fr Jolly's modest living expenses and his respect for parish financial needs are highly appreciated.

However, even with Fr Jolly's actions, in recent times the first collection donations have fallen to below what we are receiving back from the Diocese!

The Second Collection:

stays within the parish

It is gained through the envelope system,
loose cash,
regular credit card donations
regular direct debit donations

What is it used for?

All parish running expenses, including parish ministries eg. Youth, SRE program, financial support for Fr Jolly's needs, hospitality, insurance, liturgical costs, rates, electricity, water, repairs and maintenance, wages, superannuation, office expenses including computer/photocopier costs and all other costs that occur from time to time.

Our largest debt is the Bank Loan - currently liability is \$185,271.76 plus interest which will total approximately \$9000 in the 2018-2019 financial year.

Other Income:

Donations from parishioners for specific projects, eg. stained glass window.

Modest to small income through:
Non-specific donations
Advertisements in the Bulletin
Church hall hire
Piety Stall sales

Parramatta Catholic Foundation (old Diocesan Works Fund DWF) – *Parramatta Catholic Foundation* needs to raise \$2.5 million annually to sustain the works of the Church in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains - including the formation of our seminarians, providing Christian education in public schools, the empowering of our disabled with job training, supporting our deaf and housing vulnerable single mothers facing homelessness. *Parramatta Catholic Foundation* supports Holy Spirit Seminary, The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, the Ephpheta Centre and CatholicCare.

To support the funding needs of the Foundation there are 4 Parish appeals per year. Each Parish is given a quota which is related to the income of the particular parish in the prior financial year. Parishioners are asked to donate to the fund and parishes are expected to make up the balance so that the target is reached. Recently Glenbrook's donations have not reached the target and our current financial needs mean that we are significantly in arrears.

Current and future financial considerations include: (random order)

Completion of bank loan repayment in the next few years.

Provide more support to parish pastoral and educational needs especially through existing parish groups. We've managed to allocate more resources for 2018-2019 but we want to do better.

Repay the arrears owing to the Catholic Foundation.

Consider the feasibility of air conditioning of the church.


Attend to some more costly maintenance needs of the church and other buildings including the presbytery. Some of this maintenance needs to take place in 2019.

Replacement car for Fr Jolly when his car is no longer sustainable.

Below are 2 graphs regarding our progress towards eliminating our bank loan.

It is hoped that you will be pleased. Your ongoing financial support through the Second Collection has created this result! We want to recognize the faithful patience that you display with the many dreams you hold for the future for our parish while we all work to achieve real financial viability and sustainability. We too share these same dreams.

Beyond ongoing parishioner monetary contributions, <u>the significant actions</u> which have contributed to the <u>marked reduction of bank debt</u> over a relatively short period of time are:

- the astute stewardship (and worry) by Fr Jolly to help us meet our financial obligations;
- the renegotiation of the bank loan to more favourable arrangements which includes paying down the loan amount (the capital) at a faster rate than previously;
- reviewing various parish accounts such as electricity provider and the photocopier supplier to achieve better terms and at a cheaper price;
- developing realistic and affordable annual budgets.
