FATHER JOLLY'S WEEKLY REFLECTION "Evangelization is not possible without the action of the Holy Spirit, the most convincing dialectic has no power over the heart".

(Pope John Paul II).

Today is a great day of rejoicing for the church. The Holy Spirit has been poured out on us. The Holy Church was born today! The whole church rejoices for the gift of God's own Spirit who is her comforter and counsellor.

We all look forward to that day when there will be no more Covid-19. We all look forward that day when there will be no enemies, no blaming of each other and hatred of one another and the world will work together for the discovery of a new vaccine that will stop the spread of Covid-19. We all look forward to that day when all people will be able to hug each other, speak in harmony and their minds apprehend alike. We all look forward to that day when fear is gone and peace will rule the day because Christ will rule the hearts. We look forward to that day when all people with charity for all in their heart will join the Psalmist in singing in one voice: "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity". That is our desire and wish.

Can this become a reality? Yes, it can: provided we have the Holy Spirit assisting us. The Spirit of God achieved such a community on the day of Pentecost.

The greatest fruit of redemption is the outpouring of the Holy Spirit into our hearts. Jesus had already promised at the Last Supper, "I will pray to the Father and He will give you another counsellor to be with you forever. The Spirit of Truth" (John 14:16).

For the Apostles, this event meant they were no longer the fear-stricken, ignorant men. Fear had given way to courage. They opened the closed doors. They stepped out with undying faith in the indwelling Spirit. They were so animated now that nothing could stop them. The outpouring of the Spirit had an effect on the community as a whole as well. They were united in mind and heart. The Holy Spirit draws people together into a community of believers. Through the power of the Spirit, language barriers crumbled. It is with this event that the Church was born. Those who heard the word, grew in their faith and discovered that they too had gifts given by the Spirit to share with the Community. The Spirit brought together not only the dispersed nations but also the confused disciples, so that they were immediately transformed into the Body of Christ. The same Spirit is with us and can do the same today for the Church and the world. But the Spirit of God needs you and me, the Spirit needs us, his Church to form that body. The Spirit needs us to cooperate with Him in the transformation of the world. We must allow the Spirit to blossom in us into works. We must first work to transform our own churches into a united, loving, forgiving and sharing community. Our Parish must become truly the Body of Christ, in which all our individual gifts are put at the service of the community, in the belief that "There are different gifts but the same Spirit, there are different ministries but the same Lord" (1Cor 12:4). Having set our own house in order, we then reach out beyond the confines of our Parish Community. The words of Jesus, "As the Father has send me, so I send you" (John 20:21) were directed towards you and me. Therefore, as God's people, we are bound to function as divine agents in the world, to break down the walls of pride, division, hatred and prejudice.

Reflection on the Gospel

The feast of Pentecost celebrates the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and energising them to set about their mission of continuing the ministry of Jesus. The gospel reading is one of the post-resurrection appearances by Jesus when he breathed the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. The actual events of that first Pentecost are recorded in the book of Acts and are recalled in this week's first reading. The use of this post-resurrection gospel account is a reminder that Jesus had already imbued the disciples with the Spirit but, as so often throughout his ministry, they were a bit slow to catch on to the significance of what he had done. It seems that they needed a more tangible experience to jolt them into action and Acts records the very physical experience of the Spirit entering their midst as a roaring wind before settling upon them as tongues of flame. Jesus had breathed the Spirit upon them but it took the roaring wind to make a real impression on the disciples. There are frequent references in the gospels to Jesus being 'filled with the Spirit'. It is this Spirit with which he was filled that he breathed upon his disciples; it is that same Spirit that we receive sacramentally in Confirmation.

For the weeks following the death of Jesus the disciples had lived in fear and confusion, not fully understanding what had happened and not really knowing what to do. When they realised that the Spirit Jesus had breathed upon them was really present and urging them to action they finally had the courage to begin the mission that Jesus had entrusted to them: to spread the Good News of Jesus and continue to realise his message in the world.
