FATHER JOLLY'S WEEKLY REFLECTION

Our attitudes are the mother of all our actions. Before anything moves toward action, it must first be an attitude. Then it becomes a perception, an idea and it becomes a feeling and moves into a decision. Nothing can happen without having an attitude. Our attitudes direct and define our lives. In today's First reading we see Solomon having the right attitude in life. The Lord appears to him and asks him in a dream "Ask what you would like me to give you". If you were asked this question by the Lord, what would each of us be asking the Lord? Solomon's answer was "Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil". The Lord said to Solomon, yes, you have asked the right thing. You have the right attitude in life. You did not ask for riches or long life or victory over your enemies. Yes, you have asked for the gift of discernment and gift of wisdom. The book of Proverbs says, "Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore get Wisdom: and with all you are getting get understanding" (Proverb 4:7). There is nothing more important in life than having a proper discernment. Solomon chose to receive this gift and blessing from the Lord above everything else. What is discernment? Discernment is the ability to decide between truth and error, right and wrong. Discernment is the process of making careful distinctions in our thinking about truth. Discernment in life is important because it is the key to living an uncompromising life. It is the ability to exercise wisdom in every area of one's life.

Unfortunately, discernment is an area where most Christians stumble. Many times we are not armed enough to take a decidedly strong stand against the evil things. In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul points out to us the importance of proper discernment by saying "We know that by turning everything to their good, God co-operates with those who love him, with all those that he has called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28). It is true discernment that helps us to discover God's purpose for each of us at each moment. It is through this discernment that we come to share his glory. Thus today's Second Reading invites us to discern and co-operate with God's plan for all of us. True discernment ultimately leads us to the discovery of true treasures in life. Just think for a moment the tremendous joy of the two men of the parable in today's Gospel reading must have felt when one discovered a hidden treasure and the other a priceless pearl (Matthew 13:44-46)! One discovered the treasure by chance, while the other discovered the pearl by deliberate search. They were ready to make any sacrifice and give up everything that was less value, compared to the joy and happiness the treasure and pearl brought to them.

Yet it is not for pearl or this kind of treasure that ultimately our hearts yearn. These are images of the reality and not the reality. The reality for which our hearts yearn is for the reality of eternal joy.

Those who discover this joy are the blessed ones. May we always discern God's will with the hope of receiving eternal joy. May we discern God's will with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Let our prayer to the Holy Spirit be:

Holy Spirit come, Fill me with your wisdom today and be near me. Speak in your still sweet voice to me so that My soul may find answers to the many questions that I alone cannot find. Stay with me all the time, so that I may celebrate The blessing of everlasting joy.



COLUMBARIUM

Please see the design and draft plan of the proposed Columbarium. Your suggestions and recommendations are most welcome. We are in the prosses of forming a little committee to work out the details of this project and we have a small group of parishioners who are already part of this process. If anyone is interested to be part of this committee please let the Parish Office know.

PARISH FINANCE COMMITTEE

This committee met recently to review the financial affairs of the parish and advise Fr Jolly on related matters. Key points from this meeting included:

- Please see the graphic of our Parish Financial Status on the noticeboard.
- The construction of a Columbarium (a structure with recesses in the walls to receive the ashes of the dead) at the parish has now been approved by both the Bishop and Blue Mountains Council. More information on this project will be disseminated to parishioners as soon as possible.
- A Tap'n'Go electronic donating procedure will be introduced to the parish as soon as equipment becomes available. This will allow parishioners to make their weekly contributions to the parish by electronic means instead of having to make sure they have cash with them.
- Solar panels on the presbytery roof will further reduce the cost of electricity to the parish. These panels were able to be financed by a parishioner donation.
- Membership of the Parish Finance Committee will be reviewed at its next meeting
