God will continue to nurture us. In today's Gospel we see the multiplication of the bread. Jesus multiplies the bread and feeds all the people. In order to do this nurturing he takes what the disciples had. He takes the five loaves and two fish. The same way the Lord asks us to give to him the five loaves and two fish we have, so that the Lord's hand can feed everyone and answer all our needs as well as the rest of the world. The Lord needs our five loaves and two fish. As the Lord continues to nurture us and feed us, may we allow the Lord to use freely the five loaves and two fish in our hands to become the nurturing bread and fish for the rest of the humanity. Let us give our five loaves and the two fish into the hands of the Lord. He knows how to multiply them and in his hand they are good for five thousand men, ten thousand women and twenty thousand children and even more.

#### Institute for Mission Reflective Ministry Program starts 18 August


