Isaiah's condemnation of Israel in that passage is so strong that one can almost imagine Jesus' audience cringing in anticipation of where this story was leading.  The imagery Jesus used would have been so familiar to his audience that it was almost mundane, and yet Jesus, as usual, gives the image a twist. He describes a vineyard owner whose tenant farmers rebel, beat and murder his servants. Any one of these acts was punishable by death and the audience may well have expected the story to end there. And yet the landowner sends further messengers – hopeful of a change of heart from the tenants and allowing them the opportunity to do what is right. After these messengers are also

### ST. FINBAR'S PARISH NEWS

<u>COLUMBARIUM</u> The Parish Columbarium Committee met last week and got many things underway. The contract documentation is being examined to make sure the rights of both the Parish and the next of kin of those interred are protected, and that procedures and payments are all properly documented and explained. We have to also make sure we comply with the conditions of approval from the Blue Mountains Council. Some Committee members are exploring the type and colour of the face bricks to be used. Other members are working out the details of the wall construction so that the standard sized container for the ashes of the deceased can be accommodated in an efficient manner. Other members are sorting out the lighting and the cameras that will provide some security for the site. Others are sorting out the financial and administrative arrangements. You can see there is a lot to organise, but the Committee hopes the wall will be constructed before Christmas so that interments can take place from early in the new year. Vince Dobson and Carl Moll are two key Committee members who I think would be happy to talk to you after Mass any weekend. *WEDDING* We welcome back Fr Jolly who will be returning to the Parish briefly for the wedding of *Rebecca Rydzewski & Jordan Barrett.* We wish the bride and groom well on their special day, and hope that God will bless their union.

<u>GARDENS</u> The Parish is indebted to the various garden committee members who volunteer on a regular basis to keep the Parish and Presbytery grounds looking good. Special thanks to Tricia and Kieran who have given a lot of their time over recent months to planting many new plants and shrubs, and spreading the huge mounds of donated wood shavings over the gardens. They also have disposed of the vast amount of garden refuse and provided some garden furniture. Every parishioner should take the time to do the prayer walk around the Stations of the Cross, and while doing so, admire the great work Tricia and Kieran have done.

ST. FINBAR'S FEAST DAY. The Feast Day of St Finbar (also spelled Finbarr, Fionbharr, Findbarr, Barra, Barr and Barry) was on the 25th of September. Finbar was named Lochlan, and was born in mid to late 6th century in Cork, Ireland, to a father who was a metal worker, and a slave in the Irish royal court. He was tonsured and educated at a monastery in Kilkenny, where the monks called him Fionbharr, Finbarr or Finbar - meaning "fairheaded one". As an adult, Finbar accompanied some monks on at least two pilgrimages to Rome, and also visited with St David of Mynyw in Wales on his return journey. Finbar was an energetic preacher in the south of Ireland and possibly, in Scotland. For part of his life, Finbar lived as an anchorite (a religious hermit who takes vows of full seclusion) on an island in lake Gougane Barra. He was later joined by others from southern Ireland. Eventually, Finbar founded a monastery and school near his hermitage at Gougane Barra, which became famous and attracted many monks and students. Finbar also erected several churches in neighbouring areas.



Finbar's most famous and influential monastery was established on the river Lee, Cork, where he served as its first Abbot and was also consecrated as the first bishop of Cork. This monastery became the centre of monasticism in southern Ireland. It was known as a centre of learning, were the school-seminary taught spiritual and secular sciences to students, and prepared seminarians for the priesthood. The monastery also provided refuge and shelter for the sick and poor.

Throughout his life, Finbar visited the monasteries, churches and chapels he established, especially Gougane Barra where he sometimes withdrew for quiet prayer. He erected at least 12 churches in the Cork region during his ministry there, and tirelessly preached the Gospel throughout his life.

May St Finbar be an inspirational guide for prayer and sharing the Gospel, leading you ever closer to God. May you feel the warmth and light of God's unconditional love burning brightly in your soul, just as you have given warmth and light to our brothers and sisters in need through your kind-hearted spirit.
