ALL SOULS MASS:

This year will be celebrated on Monday the 2nd of November, 2020 at 7pm. The celebration of the Eucharist will be offered for all the faithful departed with special remembrance of those whose funeral took place at St. Finbar's during the past year. Also invited to participate in the liturgy are parishioners who have lost a close relative during the past year and whose funeral was conducted outside the Parish. A candle ceremony will be part of the celebration so if you would like your loved one remembered by lighting a candle (which your family member will place on the sanctuary during the Mass), please contact the Parish Office on 47398928 before the 28th of October. A small framed photo of your loved one could also be placed on the sanctuary before the commencement of Mass. *TIMEOUT TUESDAY*

WORKING WITH CHILDREN:

It is a legal requirement that all parishioners who have any contact with children in their parish duties are required to complete a Working With Children Check, and to have that check formally registered with the Diocese. This especially includes Priests, Parish Staff, Sacristans, Senior Servers, Musicians, SRE teachers, Youth Group Leaders, Play Group Leaders, Sacramental Co-ordinators and possibly others. If you do not have such a check, or you are unsure about it, please contact the parish office urgently. Those who already have this check will be aware that it has to be renewed every five years, and some parishioners will be getting a reminder that their check is soon due for renewal.

COLUMBARIUM MATTERS:

The Parish Columbarium Committee has again met to progress this project. A number of sample bricks were looked at, and a choice of brick was made that should blend in with the church and the environment. In addition, a discounted price was negotiated for the purchase and delivery of the bricks. While we are not yet in a position to accept any formal applications for Columbarium niches or any monies, you can express your interest in the purchase of one or more niches by contacting Juliana in the parish office and she will add your name and contact details to a list she is maintaining. The parish will continue to keep you informed of progress on a regular basis.

Fr John Frauenfelder & the Diocese of Wollongong, Parishes Working Together 2013 (Video approx.: 20 mins) Fr John Frauenfelder reflects on the 2013 Pastoral Plan from the Diocese of Wollongong. Whilst the plan was some ago, the principles and reflections that Fr John offers are still very relevant to our Church today. A Graduate of Catholic University of America and San Francisco Theological Seminary (Member Institute of Graduate Theological Union, Berkeley), John graduated with Master's and Doctorate degrees in liturgical studies, theology, and ministry. Later studies, through St Louis University, awarded him a degree in Health Care Ethics. John has spent over 30 years in parish ministry. He had led parish & school retreats, workshops in Spiritualty for the Ageing, teaching Eucharist and other aspects of Eucharistic Spirituality, including Going to Mass Backwards, reflection days for Clergy and Retreats for Seniors. He has spent time in Central Queensland, working with the Bishops Inservice Days (Diocese of Rockhampton) and Adult Faith Education at Blackwater, Queensland. Working with St John of God Health (Burwood & Richmond), John developed his skills as a leader in Mission, a work enhanced through many years of mission engagement with Mercy in the former Goulburn Congregation of Sisters of Mercy, and his work in Mercy Health & Aged Care in Central Queensland. After time lecturing in Liturgy and Sacraments, and three years as Academic Dean, at Broken Bay Institute, John has spent the past seven years assisting in Adult Faith formation for Catholic Schools Office in Diocese of Broken Bay. 
