

Location: On the pedestals just before the entry doors into the main part of the church.



Are you using your credit or debit card instead of carrying cash?

We invite you to donate to the upkeep of our church and parish ministries by using our Tap 'n Go Terminals!

This does NOT replace the Second Collection Envelope System, nor the facility to make regular or occasional contributions via your credit card or debit card facility on the Parish's website. All these methods WILL **CONTINUE!** <u>Tap 'n Go is just an extra way for people to contribute without the need for cash.</u>

Its usage covers both the first and second collections.

The money will be allocated between the 2 collections in proportion to what is usually received. Each tap of your card = \$5 donation. Tap twice if you want to donate \$10, 3 times for \$15 and so on......The tapping function is: instantaneous - no waiting

SECURE

No receipt – it will be itemised on your bank statements, Available 7 days per week You may use the machine upon your entry or after mass or whenever you may visit the church. This facility has been arranged through the Parramatta Diocese. The service provider is the Commonwealth Bank. The Wi-Fi service is via Optus.


