Once Mikhail Bakunin (18 May said: "By striving to do the impossible, man has always achieved what is possible. Those who have caut1814 – 1 July 1876), a Russian revolutionary anarchist, iously done no more than they believed possible have never taken a single step forward." Bakunin believed in the unlimited capabilities of humans. The only obstacle is fear because fear is a step backwards.

Fr Joe's Musings

Today, it seems that science has taken Bakunin by his own words. With the speed of the internet, we can access instantly mass information on all topics of interest. The advances in science and technology are impressive and perhaps even beyond our imagination. Attempts have been made to unlock the mystery of the incarnation of the Son of God. However, this proof must be done differently. Evidence that Jesus was God Incarnate is provided by the kind of life he led, and its culmination in the Resurrection. Pope Benedict XVI describes Jesus' way of life as "pro-existence": In his "being for others". Jesus becomes the face of his Father's mercy. It through this mercy that Mary was chosen to be the mother of Jesus. This is only possible because God can make impossible things possible. Hence, Mary could say: "May it be done to me according to your word."

Pope Benedict XVI reflects on the role of Mary in the history of salvation: "Mary's 'YES' is therefore the door through which God was able to enter the world, to become man. So it is that Mary is truly and profoundly involved in the Mystery of the Incarnation, of our salvation. And the Incarnation, the Son's becoming man, was the beginning that prepared the ground for the gift of himself; for giving himself with great love on the Cross to become Bread for the life of the world. Hence sacrifice, priesthood and Incarnation go together, and Mary is at the heart of this mystery."

Mary's 'YES' and our 'YES' may be taken as evidence against the distortion of the worldview that convinces us that no one — not even God — could love us.

Today, I would like to take up this opportunity to thank you for your YES and for your generous participation in the parish's life. From the very beginning of my ministry here in Glenbrook, I have always stressed that you are the real guardians and stewards of our parish. Priests come and go!

On behalf of the parish staff, please accept our sincere gratitude. We normally would have a thank you party for volunteers. COVID-19 has not allowed this to happen. However, we intend to have a WELCOME BACK PARTY in February 2021.

May I wish you all a joyous and blessed Christmas.



TAP'N'GO TERMINALS

You will have noticed the two Tap'n'Go terminals in the Narthex of the church.



This is in response to the cultural change whereby less people carry loose cash on them when they come to Mass and so are not able to contribute to the first or second collections.

Now all you have to do is tap your card once on either terminal to make a \$5 donation, tap twice for a \$10 donation etc. Use any card that you would normally use when making retail purchases, or use your phone if you have your card on your phone. (Each month the revenue from these terminals will be divided between the first and second collections in line with the ratio that has normally existed between these two collections in the past).

Please note that these terminals do NOT replace your envelopes, direct debit or credit card donations – please keep these going as usual.


