Ordinary Time Week I, Year I	1.00pm Bowlers	Specifically, the question was whether baptisms conferred with the formula, "We baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," rather than the traditional, "I baptize you," are valid, and whether persons baptized with the modified formula must be baptized in forma absoluta, meaning, that the person should be considered unbaptized, as opposed to "doubtfully" baptized. In its response, the Vatican Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith ruled that baptisms using the modified formula were invalid, and thus that people who received the sacrament with that formula must be baptized using the regular one.

#### Re: COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Update

NSW Health has revised the COVID-19 guidelines for all places of worship.

- 1) Places of Worship and Religious Services
  Effective from midnight 2 January 2021, the maximum number of people who can attend religious gatherings will be limited to 1 person per 4 square metres up to a maximum of 100 people.
  Weddings and funerals will also be limited to 1 person per 4 square metres up to a maximum of 100 people.
- Face masks
   Face masks are now mandatory at places of worship.
   Non-compliance with wearing face masks will attract a \$200 on-the-spot-fine for individuals.
   Children under 12 are exempt, but are encouraged to wear masks where practicable.
- 3) QR Code
  The church has acquired a QR code for parishioners. Please make sure to register using your mobile phone before entering the church. For those who don't have a mobile phone, if you can add your name to the attendance list located on the Warden's table.
- 4) Pews Cleaning after each Mass.
  Please help keep the church free from Covid-19 by cleaning the church pews after attending church.

#### Fr Joe's Musings—Continue from the first page

Why is it so important to adhere to the correct formulation? The words pronounced in a sacramental context express the true reality that is hidden in the sacrament. When the minister recites the words, "I baptize you...," the note said, "he does not speak as a functionary who carries out a role entrusted to him," but through his ministry signals the presence of Christ, "who acts in his Body to give his grace." acts in his Body to give his grace.

To modify the sacramental formula, the congregation said, "implies a lack of an understanding of the very nature of the ecclesial ministry that is always at the service of God and his people and not the exercise of a power that goes so far as to manipulate what has been entrusted to the Church in an act that pertains to the tradition." To modify the sacramental formula on one's own initiative "does not constitute simply a liturgical abuse, like the transgression of a positive norm, but a *vulnus* (wound) inflicted upon the ecclesial communion and the identifiability of Christ's action."

#### ANNUAL WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE SICK.
