FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Dear Friends.

This week is the start of the new school year for thousands of teachers and students. On behalf of St Finbars, I would like to extend our well wishes to our teachers and students, especially those who commence their school career this year. When I was a student in Germany, I read these wise words from a German educator: "We do not learn for the school only; but we also learn for life."

As for the school, so I would like to welcome you all back to our parish. Last week was the sad anniversary of the outbreak of COVID 19 which has infected millions of people. So far, Australia has been faring quite well. Of course, we should not forget that there are people affected indirectly by this pandemic. Our parish life is slowly recovering after the imposition of much needed restrictions by authorities. Some of our parishioners are still nervous and are still undecided whether to attend the Masses and other social events of the parish. May I say that St Finbar's is pretty safe because we all take the health and safety of our parishioners very seriously. To mark a "new year" for our parish, we would like to invite you to a "welcoming back party" on Sunday 6 February after the 9.30am Mass with sausage sizzle and morning tea and some music. Of course, it depends on the easing of restrictions.

I am also pleased to announce that out Columbarium is ready for the inurement of the ashes. I would like to thank our members of the Columbarium committee for hardworking ethos and dedication over many years. There is little doubt that their love for God and for our parish is very visible in the way they have given themselves to this project. We are the only parish with a Columbarium in the Blue Mountains. The aim of our Columbarium is to enhance the pastoral care of parishioners beyond death since they will always be remembered during the daily parish Masses.

In Rom 8:38-39 we read: "For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, **shall** be able to **separate us** from the love of **God**, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." Some weeks ago, the diocese has encouraged us to explore points of collaboration between St Finbar's and Emu Plains. Fr. Michael, who is currently the temporary administrator of Emu Plains, and I have met to discuss this issue. At this point of time, we don't see many opportunities that would benefit both parishes. We also need to acknowledge that Emu Plains and Glenbrook are culturally two independent parishes which belong to different councils. Emu Plains has expressed this very clear to the diocesan authorities at their meetings (we have not been included in these discussions). We also need to wait to see who the diocese will appoint as new parish priest to Emu Plains.

A last word on our parish finances. We just would like to thank you for your generous support during COVID 19 and we hope that you continue to do so. After all, it is OUR parish and we are ALL together stewards of OUR parish. Additional to your generous contribution, the parish also receives a big financial boost in the form of Jobkeeper subsidy (for details, see the insert in the BARRA). This program will terminate by 1st April. We are unsure about its impact on our administrative staff etc. Have a good weekend.

COLUMBARIUM NOW AVAILABLE FOR USE

The Columbarium Committee met recently to tidy up quite a lot of matters so that the Columbarium could be brought into use. That point has now arrived and parishioners who wish to purchase a niche for use either now or later may proceed to obtain a copy of the Niche Contract from the parish office and make the payment.

The niche price has been set at \$2250 for now, and this amount needs to be paid to the parish in full as the first step. This can be done electronically, by cheque or cash or any way that is easy for you.

The next step is to visit the parish office where Juliana will enter all the details onto the Parish Columbarium database, issue you with a receipt, get you to sign your contract and Fr Joe will countersign it.

If you wish to nominate a particular niche at this stage you may do so. There are five Columbarium Blocks, named after saints Finbar, Matthew, Mark Luke and John, and each Block has niches on the north (road) side and the south (church) side. There is a plan of all niches in the parish office. Your niche details will be entered into the database so it will be reserved for you.

If the niche is for later use, that is all you need to do.

If you would like to use the niche in the near future, you will also need to discuss with Fr Joe an appropriate time for the Inurnment Rite. You will also need to decide on the wording for your plaque.

The cost of the plaque will be invoiced to you at a later date.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN (WWC) CHECKS: As the parish ministries get back into action, it is timely to check that the parish complies with the Government and Diocesan rules for WWC checks.

Those with existing checks just need to keep their details current and a renewal notice will come to you. For anyone who might be new to a parish ministry (or who is unsure about their WWC check), you need to make sure all is well. Any parishioner in the following ministries needs to have a current WWC check: Sacristan, Senior Server, Reader, Catechist, Children's Liturgy, Youth Group Leaders, Playgroup Leaders Sacramental Co-ordinators, Baptism Team, as well as the Parish Priest and Parish office staff. Please direct any queries to Peter in the Parish office.




