# FR JOE'S MUSINGS

#### And he said quite openly (plainly)...

If we want to add gravity to a point we want to underscore, we often say: "Honestly, I tell you that it is so!" We all know that speaking in truth will not always be appreciated. This is more so in a time when "alternative facts" are being taken for truths; or truths are quickly labelled as "fake news".

In the Gospel of Mark that we read this Sunday, Jesus also speaks quite frankly to his disciples. He declared openly that He "must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again." Like us, Peter cannot accept this truth and quickly dismissed it as "fake news" since Jesus' statement of truth does not concur with his personal view of truths. In Peter's opinion, God who is almighty and powerful cannot suffer. Sufferings and Power are mutually exclusive.

Peter's belief reflects the traditional Greek philosophy that advocates for the IMPASSIBILITY of God. Accordingly, God cannot suffer since He is unchanging. Hence, divine impassibility is based on God's immutability. Yet, the Bible presents God as vulnerable since He is full of love. Since God is love, He is also compassionate. In Jeremiah 14:17 we read also that Yahweh speaks of shedding "tears night and day." Gordon McConville writes that verses 17–18 "represent again the pain of the Lord through the mouth, and the experience, of Jeremiah. The Lord is not indifferent to the grief of the people, even though he himself brings it upon them as judgment. His mourning corresponds to Judah's." Other biblical passages go as far as to say that God repents.

Why? Because God's repentance is the beginning of salvation for humanity! God's repentance is not an emotion of his Being but a <u>change of treatment towards mankind from a human point of view</u>. We should remember what Paul taught almost two thousand years ago, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" (Rom 8:28)

In his Son Jesus, God suffers for us because we have become impassibly indifferent to the cry of the poor. Our hearts are hardened at the injustice and sufferings of others around us. God is hurt because we hurt others through our actions and words. He agonizes because of our selfishness that often spreads untruths and fake news or alternative facts.

The Greek word for speaking PLAINLY is PARRHESIA which the ancient Greeks used only in the context of friendship. Plutarch wrote once: "Frankness of speech, by common report and belief, is the language of friendship especially (as an animal has its peculiar cry), and on the other hand, that lack of frankness is unfriendly and ignoble." (Plutarch, How to Tell a Flatterer from a Friend, 51).

Only in the circle of friends can one speak openly without fear: "I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father." (John 15:13-15).

Lent is a time for us to renew our friendship with Jesus who calls us to speak and to act <u>openly</u> for the benefit of others (and not to deceive others). Jesus gave everything to his friends—his knowledge of God and his own life. Jesus is our model for friendship—because he loved without limits—and he makes it possible for us to live a life of friendship—because we have been transformed by everything he shared with us.

#### PROJECT COMPASSION STORY FOR THIS SUNDAY

Margret is a teacher at a vocational school for deaf students in the Solomon Islands that suffered lone-term water shortages and damage from Tropical Cyclone Harold. With Caritas Australia's support, Margret's school installed water tanks, repaired cyclone damage and implemented Covid-19 prevention measures, and is now planning to boost food security.
