### FR JOE'S MUSINGS

## The zeal for your house will devour me...

While reading and studying the gospel of this Sunday, the images of the hostility and violence that have erupted over and vandalised the Capitol in Washington immediately penetrate my mind. How is such a violence possible in country that prides itself as the guardian of democracy? Whatever the reason, violence is never the answer. There are alternative tools and means to achieve changes; but viciousness ought not be among

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus is reported to have come to Jerusalem where he was using a cord whip to drive all salespeople including their animals and vendors and moneychangers out of the Temple. We should not deny that Jesus' action involved some violence here. So, should we then compare Jesus with the recent event in Washington where elected politicians and lawmakers were protected from the brutality of the invaders?

It all comes down to the right reason! For sure, the mob acted without legitimacy and authority. They did neither show any concern nor respect for the life of other. In contrast to the mob, Jesus acted from the authority of being the Son of God. Since he is the beloved Son of the Father to whom all things in heaven and on earth belong, Jesus also shares in the authority of his heavenly Father. That is the reason why he drove out all practices aliened to the 'house of his Father". In doing so, Jesus restores the right relationship between the people and his Father. This relationship is a pure gift by God; and cannot be a matter of commerce to which the Temple has been reduced to. Nobody can buy nor pay for this gift of grace. To underline this pure and gracious gift, the gospel of John continues to say that Jesus gave up his life in order to enable a new life in a new sanctuary not built by human hands.

What Jesus did was to take away all practices that reduce relationship to commodities which can be exchanged in a free market of capitals. The value of a human person is not based on the person's shares at stock exchanges or the portfolio of the properties a person has accumulated over the course of life. Rather, in Jesus' eyes the person is invaluable in terms of capital since each person is made in the image of his Father who lets the sun shine on the bad and good. Hence, the Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "It is in Christ, "the image of the invisible God", that each person has been created "in the image and likeness" of the Creator. It is in Christ, Redeemer and Saviour, that the divine image, disfigured in man by the first sin, has been restored to its original beauty and ennobled by the grace of God." (CCC, no. 1701).

Such was the zeal that consumes Jesus. The purpose is not to destroy and to tear down, but to ennoble life that often has been reduced to an exchangeable commodity to be exploited by those with power.
