FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Why are you troubled?

On the third Sunday of Easter, we continue to hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his Resurrection. Today's reading, taken from the Gospel of Luke, follows immediately after the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is the event being recounted by the disciples in the opening verse of today's Gospel.

Consistently in the reports of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances, Jesus greets his disciples with the words, "Peace be with you." This is a most appropriate greeting. The disciples have witnessed the death of Parish Priest: Fr Joseph Lam OSA someone they loved, and they now fear for their own lives as well. Peace is what they need more than anything else. Jesus often connects this greeting of peace with another gift—forgiveness. In today's Gospel, this connection is made in the final verses.

If we rely on numbers, it seems that the Church has nothing to worry about. In its latest Statistic Yearbook, the so-called Annuario Pontificio, the Vatican globally records a steady increase of eighteen percent in Catholic population compared to the previous year. Now, there are worldwide 1.34 billion Catholics which are around 18% of the world's population. At the end of 2019, 48.1% of the world's Catholics were living in the Americas, followed by Europe with 21.2%, Africa with 18.7%, about 11% in Asia (all figures for Asia exclude China) and 0.8 percent in Oceania.

We know that statistics do not tell the whole truth. While the Church is thriving in other parts of the world, the western Catholicism has been in steady decline since decades. Between 2011 and 2016, the number of Catholics has shrunk, and the proportion of Catholics in the population also has decreased. There are many causes and many more challenges that have contributed to this decline. The drop in number of Catholics naturally has resulted in a reduction of religious and priestly vocations as well. We also need to keep in mind that many people of goodwill, religious and priests, have left the Church. Now, only one sheep remains, while the other ninety-nine sheep have run away from the Church.

What we need in this time is to pray for an increase in vocations, both lay ministerial vocations and religious and priestly vocations. The Church is best served if all work together as one Body of Christ. A culture which clericalizes the laity or laicizes the clergy will bring only conflict. Peace can be achieved only when we all walk together in the love of God – a love that is ready to forgive – and in the love for each other. When we respect and accept each other's talents and giftedness, the Church of God will shine forth as a prophetic sign of peace in this world torn apart by dissention and friction. Not polarization and politics in the Church, but a willingness to serve and to labour in the vineyard of the Lord will bring peace. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit guides us in our discernment. May He teach us the true meaning of humility: Greatness in God's eyes is seen through humble service. The goal of godly leadership is serving with a humble heart. Humility is revealed in a leader when we are serving God and serving others. Humility is offering up our lives for others to see the love of Christ, for them, in us.


