#### FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Lest we forget...

This Sunday, the second reading is taken from the First Epistle of John. There, John reminded and commended the sacrificial love of Jesus Christ. Then, he asked his readers to imitate Christ's sacrifice: 'We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us--and we ought to lay down our lives for one another.' (1 John 3:16)

Anzac Day falls this year on the fourth Sunday of Easter. Every year on the 25th of April, Australians and New Zealanders celebrate Anzac Day and gather to remember and honour the fallen and pay their respects. The 25<sup>th</sup> April was the **day** when the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps landed on the Gallipoli Peninsula in 1915. The site where the Anzacs landed at Gallipoli was renamed Anzac Cove. More than 11,000 Anzacs died at Gallipoli and a further 23,500 were wounded. In 1916, the 25<sup>th</sup> April was officially named Anzac Day, while it was not a public holiday in New Zealand until 1921.

Those who went off to serve in the World War I surely have given up their lives for a cause that was much bigger than themselves. When we come together to remember the sacrifices of the fallen soldiers who were our relatives and friends, who were our loved ones, we do not glorify the war. That would just undermine the cost of war that has taken so many lives. Rather, we remember the sacrifices and sufferings without which peace cannot be achieved.

"Lest we forget", the most haunting words of any Anzac service, remind us of the terrible price we pay if we forget to count the cost and suffering of war. Many Anzac Day ceremonies include a prayer for peace. To remember war is to remember to avoid war unless it is necessary.

As Christians, we look up to Christ whose life is spent to protect his sheep from the "wolves". He gave up his life for his flock because they are his. He was not a hired man who would run off when he encountered threats and danger. It is for this reason that Jesus is the good shepherd. Importantly, Jesus' sacrificial death is not the end, but a beginning of a new era. As Prince of Peace, Jesus' death has enabled peace to prosper. Jesus' life and ministry represent the supreme revelation of the Father's love for humanity (cf. Jn 3:16). He is the Good Samaritan who stoops to help the injured man, binds his wounds and cares for him (cf. *Lk* 10:30-37).

In our current political landscape, there are still too many "wolves" who make a living either from creating conflicts or by fostering wars. However, every life will end in loneliness, even for the power-hungry. Their glory bought with the blood of the innocents will be the cause of their own demise. We only need to read the book of history.

At the culmination of his mission, Jesus gave the ultimate proof of his care for us by offering himself on the cross to set us free from the slavery of sin and death. By the sacrificial gift of his life, he opened for us the path of love. To each of us he says, "Follow me; go and do likewise" (cf. Lk 10:37). Hence, Jesus is the compass of love and peace, of fraternity and solidarity, of mutual support and acceptance.

What we need is not a culture of confrontation and hatred, but rather a culture of reconciliation and mutual care.
