FR JOE'S MUSINGS

What would you be without your mother....?

On this Sunday we celebrate our nannies and mums. Mother's Day is not a public holiday, and most businesses follow regular Sunday opening hours in Australia, a website informs us. Perhaps, it just reveals a truth: mums never take holidays!

There are the 114,800 mums who work, study and care for their children under the age of 15 at the same time. According to the 2016 Census, full-time working mothers were mostly employed in primary or secondary education, hospitals, and aged care. The most common occupation for mothers working full-time was as a general clerk performing administrative duties. For those working part-time, most were employed as sales assistants. As for housework, half of mums aged between 20 and 49 do 15 or more hours of unpaid domestic work a week. A recent study reveals that an average mum clocks in a staggering average of 98 hours a week which is essentially equivalent to working 2.5 full-time jobs.

So, what is the economic value of a mum? Again, a study by an insurer shows that the work many mums typically perform for their households could justify an income of A\$93,920.

"We all understand that mums perform an invaluable service," Penny Gusner. "The Mother's Day Index illustrates how losing this critical individual can be financially devastating — even if you don't have existing financial challenges."

However, there is something invaluable. Often mothers are not just the one who give birth; they are also our spiritual leader. In this way, they nurture us in our physical and spiritual growth. Mothers are constantly seeking to encourage growth and development in their children – and children cannot grow and develop without that input. Mothers are constantly affirming their children's attempts to develop new skills. They will push them to do things they cannot yet achieve, and be right behind them, ready to catch them when they fall, pick them up and help them try again.

There is a passage in the Old Testament that associates God with the motherly qualities. In <u>Deuteronomy 32</u>, God is described as: "Like an eagle that stirs up its nest, that flutters over its young, spreading out its wings, catching them, bearing them on its pinions." And in Hosea he says, "It was I who taught Ephraim to walk; I took them up by their arms". Mothers see when their children are almost ready to walk, and lift them up, repeatedly, holding their hands and guiding their feet. Spiritual mothers do the same.

We pray for mothers who find their lives very challenging and difficult.

To all mothers, we offer our gratitude and respect. Let us not forget the ones who have left this world. May they also be blessed with God's loving care and peace.

To all mums who are mourning the loss of their husbands and children, may they find comfort in the knowledge that they will be united again.

There is but one and only one, Whose love will fail you never. One who lives from sun to sun, With constant fond endeavour. There is but one and only one On earth there is no other. In heaven a noble work was done When God gave us a Mother.

SACRAMENT OF PENANCE PREPARATION MEETINGS



"In recent months the people of East Timor have been devastated by a crippling flood crisis and now the COVID-19 pandemic has had a steep sudden rise in cases. About 46,000 homes were destroyed in this poverty stricken area just 45 mins from Darwin. The subsequent emergency overcrowding has led to the Covid figures escalating. In February only 20 case were reported. Now over 2500 cases are registered!
