FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Restless is our hearts until it finds rest in You, Lord...

The prayer above is from Augustine, the greatest Saint in the early Church. He was born in Thagaste November 354 and died in Hippo (North Africa) on 28th August 430. Augustine was highly ambitious, as he said all he wanted in his youth was to love and to be loved. We may say that he was someone who knew how to look after himself. He was a self-made person and reached the climax of his career at the imperial court of Milan where he took the office of imperial attorney general. After a tumultuous life in many aspects and intense searching for the truth, he finally was convinced that this truth is the Christian God. During the Easter vigil on 24 April 387, he was baptised by the then equally famous bishop of Milan, Ambrosius, a man of great nobility and rhetoric skill. Ambrosius was also a very pastoral leader standing firm on the word of God.

Augustine wrote a seminal work called CONFESSIONS in which he recounted the journey of his life and the grace of God that made him the humblest and yet greatest shepherd known in this time. As an ambitious lawyer, Augustine believed that the truth can be tweaked and imposed on the people. For the young Augustine truth is not given but must be invented and sold for the best possible price. Perhaps, he would make a very good lawyer in our day. One day he then realised whether anybody could have the courage to live without the Truth that is not humanly made. This question led him to an intense searching for the Truth, until he was encouraged by his friends and bishop Ambrosius to open the holy Scripture and to search there. Augustine found the random passage of Romans 13:11-14: "Let us walk decently, as in the daytime, not in partying and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensual indulgence, not in fighting and jealousy, but put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no provision for the desires of the flesh." These words of Paul have turned Augustine's life around: "My youth bubbled up and obscured and darkened my soul so far that it could not distinguish the beauty of love from the muddy darkness of lust," he remembers in his Confessions. The words went to his heart as an arrow from God, and St Augustine turned to Christ in 386 AD and was quite literally born again and became a great preacher, theologian and leader in the North African

Yet Augustine's conversion to Christianity was also an outcome of his mother Monica (her feast day is on 27th August), a woman of great faith and prayers. In the darkness of the night in the life of her son, Monica was always seen kneeling in front of the cross that can only be seen through the tiny flash of the candlelight. The fact that Monica experienced both anger towards and division from Augustine shows the power of intercessory prayer. Monica did not seek to have endless conversations with her son seeking to bring him back to the Church herself, nor did she try to shepherd him everywhere he went and force him to behave correctly. Monica instead placed her trust in God to bring Augustine back to the church. Parents especially know how difficult it can be to allow their children to fail or begin to live along a path which is ultimately immoral, as it is a natural desire to want to protect children from physical and spiritual difficulty. By her constant prayer and sacrifices, Monica showed what it meant to place all trust in God while enduring uncertainties and difficulties of many kinds.

Safeguarding Building Safe Parishes Together

#3 Update from the Office of Safeguarding's Community Engagement and Education Officer on:

The Mandatory Safeguarding Modules...

Our Church and Parish life exists within the wider community. This means that those staff and volunteers who minister within parishes also have a very real role and responsibility in meeting the challenges and expectations given to us by government and legislation. One example that we have been used to for many years is the 'Working With Children Check'.

The Diocese of Parramatta's Safeguarding Training has been designed in response to the Children's Guardian Act (2019) which was expanded to include religious organisations and volunteer workers. Safeguarding Training will help staff and volunteers understand their role and responsibility in ensuring the dignity and safety of all people is upheld.

The Training will help parishioners:

- build knowledge of Safeguarding Principles,
- develop skills in ensuring Child Safe Standards are embedded within our ministries, and
- support understanding of how to recognise and respond to incidents of 'reportable conduct'.

At the present time Safeguarding Modules can be presented online or via zoom presentations.

The Safeguarding Office has scheduled a series of dates for zoom training of the Mandatory Modules.

The Zoom dates for Modules 1-3 are listed below:

Once restrictions ease there will also be opportunities for face-to-face training.

Let your Parish Office know how you would like to participate in the training. If you would like to get started the Parish Office will help you register for the upcoming Zoom training or online modules.
