### FR JOE'S MUSINGS

The Works of Faith

When I was living in the Augustinian community in Coorparoo where I was PP, we used to have dinner together after the community evening prayer, called Vespers. As you can imagine, a meal can also provide a good opportunity for a discussion on theology. At one stage, one Augustinian raised the question about the faith and good works. In his opinion, faith is not necessary for good works since there are many

non-believers who are better human beings and do great works of charity, much better than many believers and Catholics.

I do not disagree with him on the point that there are good people who are not Christian. Indeed, this in accord with what Vatican II called people of goodwill. Yet I also argued against the separation between faith and good works. Any person who does good works does so because the person believes in the goodness of his or her doing.

This Sunday's gospel reminds us that faith in Jesus Christ necessitates works of charity. Hence, faith is the interior condition for good works. The works of faith is the expression of salvation that Christ has achieved for us. Imagine that Jesus would have had faith only but would not have died on the cross. Would faith alone be enough for salvation? So the works are the manifestations of the person's faith.

Jesus taught that a person's true nature will be evident in his or her conduct:

The good man or woman out of his or her good treasure brings forth what is good; and the evil man or woman out of his or her evil treasure brings forth what is evil. And I say to you, that for every careless word that a person shall speak, he or she shall render account for it in the day of judgment. For by your words, you shall be justified, and by your words you shall be condemned.

Important for Christians is the notion that selfishness is the opposite to faith. While we acknowledge that there are Christians whose faith has not matured into good works yet (Paul said their faith is dead!), we are not bereft of good works. According to Saint Augustine, it would be a sinful behaviour if we do not make best use of the good works God's grace has given us. On the works of righteousness, Augustine wrote:

It follows, as I see it, that in whatever kind of degree we may define righteousness in this life, there is in this life no person entirely without sin: there is need for every person to give that it may be given to him or her, to forgive that it may be forgiven him or her, and in respect of any righteousness he or she possesses not to presume that it has come of his or her own making, but to accept it as the grace of God who justifies; yet none the less to hunger and thirst for the gift of righteousness from Him who is the living bread and with whom is the well of life—who so works justification in his saints that labour in the trial of this life.

Therefore let us allow ourselves to be touched by reconciliation, which God has given us in Christ, by God's "foolish" love for us; nothing and no one can ever separate us from his love (cf. Rom 8: 39). We live in this certainty. It is this certainty that gives us the strength to live concretely the faith that works in love.

The Pandemic will serve as a good opportunity for us to demonstrate our good faith in Jesus Christ, and how our faith can mature in the care for others.

## MOUNTAINS DEANER<u>Y PASTORAL COUNCIL NEWS</u>

Because of the restrictions imposed by COVID-19 we have decided to postpone our September 19th 1. Gathering of Talents. Having said that, we were buoyed by the interest we received via the surveys returned after the concept was launched in late June.

From replies received people were interested in all the proposed workshops particularly regarding initiatives for Outreach/Pastoral Care. Be assured we will try to transform your interest into action when some normality returns to our church and community. At the moment we are looking at early next year to run the program.

We celebrated Social Justice Sunday on 29th of August. The Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement, **Cry of the Poor, Cry of the Earth** invites us to join in responding to Pope Francis' invitation to take a seven-year journey towards total ecological sustainability guided by seven Laudato Si' Goals. The Statement provides theological foundations to ground and inspire our efforts to care for creation while responding to the needs of the disadvantaged and excluded.

The Mountains Deanery vision is for a network of animators across the Deanery to bring this document to life in the Mountains.

2. Given that our Diocese now has a "Peace, Justice & Ecology" team, and that a number of Mountains' parishioners self-nominated for either the Social Justice or Laudate Si workshops at the *Gathering of Talents*, it seems that the Spirit is calling us to put the theory into practice.

Today is an opportunity to remind ourselves of the Diocese of Parramatta's Commitment to Safeguarding: *We are committed to being a community of Safeguarding* 

We will have zero tolerance to abuse of any form

We are committed to ensuring children and vulnerable adults under our care are safe, protected and enabled to flourish.

And I am excited to confirm that parishes around the diocese are demonstrating this commitment in volumes! Our September dates for zoom sessions are close to full. The October sessions are filling fast. Many others are inquiring about and registering for the online Modules. Others are looking forward to restrictions easing and the opportunity for face-to-face training within their parish. In recent weeks I have had wonderful conversations with priests, parish managers and parish volunteers who are all so committed to their parish ministry and to this training. I am grateful and energized by each one of these conversations.


