#### FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Have Changes Become the New Post-Covid Reality?

From the daily press conferences on the state of Covid 19 we have learned but one thing: Leaders persistently urge us to be prepared to live with the constant changes caused by the fluctuating nature of the Delta variant. Some people are born to love change, innovate, adapt quickly, and seek new experiences while others are genetically predisposed to stick with a routine and follow the way it's always been done. Neither is right or wrong and most people fall somewhere in the middle. It's just how our brains come wired.

I believe that we have adapted to changes very well. During the three months of lockdown, we have moved to and embraced opportunities that come along with the visual online world. They have helped us to stay connected and perhaps even allowed us to experience a sort of normality. I have heard some parishioners say that online meetings were occasions to personally relate to other parishioners and to appreciate their talents.

If there were no pandemic, we would have celebrated this weekend our St Finbar's Feast Day which falls on 25 September. We had prepared for it, games, spit roast, face painting, music etc. I would like to thank Jeanine Ashbee for her organisational talent. For sure, we will celebrate our Patron Saint later. How quickly we were able to adapt! Instead, we will have a Trivia Night via Zoom on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> October at 7.30pm. Thank you, Martin and his family (the Rogers family) for your organisation.

However, things will soon change again. Probably NSW will reopen in the first week of October. We all welcome it and can't wait to visit or to have visitors in our homes again. Yet, there are still uncertainties since we are still waiting to learn the details of the reopening. It is still to be decided who can do what. As you can imagine, such decisions are not just medical, put also political.

At this stage, we are still waiting for details and instructions by the NSW government and our diocese. The NSW bishops are currently in talks with the NSW government concerning the status of vaccination for the reopening of places of worship.

As your pastor, I am looking forward to the reopening with nervousness. How am I to navigate between the various political views and the pastoral care for every parishioner? Will I be forced to police certain issues and hence exclude others? How to keep our parishioners safe and yet welcome everyone to our liturgy? Do I need to be an authoritarian leader, or can I also be a good Samaritan stitching the wounds of the vulnerable?

As a pastor, I welcome all. I am not the judge of personal choices. Like Jesus, I pledge to care for all. Irrespective of personal views, I am called not to exclude or to divide. I would like to appeal to you: Please act responsibly and respect the safety of all parishioners! We know that the reopening will bring risks. If we look after each other in a responsible and respectful way, then I am convinced that we can keep everything going. Let us all act like good Samaritans!

In the next weeks, the parish staff will have to plan well and prepare various scenarios for the reopening of our parish. There are many things that we need to consider.
