FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit...

The holy Scripture describes the Holy Spirit in personal terms, not as an impersonal force, when it says that He teaches, guides, comforts and intercedes. He possesses emotions, intellect and will. The Holy Spirit spoke to Philip and gave counsel to the church at Jerusalem. The Acts of the Apostles relates to the Holy Spirit the gift of sharing not just of life, but of the **FAITH** as well: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, 278 delegates across Australia have gathered online for the Fifth Plenary Council which is the highest formal gathering of all local churches in a country and has legislative and governance authority. The *Assembly* aims to respond to the abuse crisis that has rocked the Church over the past decades through CONVERSION and RENEWAL. Archbishop Tim Costelloe, the President of the Plenary Council, said in his homily that the Australian Catholic Church needs to gaze on Jesus Christ and to return to Him and His "ongoing fidelity to the promise that the Holy Spirit who is sent to us by the Father, will be with us teaching us everything, and reminding us of all that Jesus has said to us."

Let us pray that the hearts and minds of the delegates are focussed on Christ, rather than advancing political agendas. The Catholic Church in Australia needs renewal, and we are not afraid of changes since the Lord Himself comforts us: "Take courage, I am with you. There is no need to be afraid." (Mt 14:27)

There are many theories advocating for institutional and structural changes. However, changes are the effects of the Holy Spirit, rather than the adaptation of external organizational models which may be aliened to the nature and identity of the Church. We need to be reminded that the Church is a Sacrament and not just an institution or a corporation. This means the Church is a visible sign of Christ in the world today! A sign and instrument of grace in the world, that emphasizes the visible (human) and invisible (Divine) nature of the Church. According to Pope Francis, the sacramental encounter is at the heart of true discipleship since mercy and justice and peace outflow from this encounter.

I am so pleased that <u>soon</u> we can reopen our church for Masses. We need to do it cautiously to minimise the risk. The parish office has elaborated a plan for the reopening. Once again, I appeal to you to be disciplined and to always adhere to the COVID safety measures when you are on the parish premises. Please be respectful to those who are vulnerable. I still need to seek advice from health experts on the ventilation and air circulation in the church. While I am confident that the size, structure, and height of the church would not expose parishioners to additional risk, it is important to consider all possibilities and to exercise best practice and duty of care. I would not want to be negligent in this regard.

Until the Bishop allows churches to re-open for Masses, we can open the church for private prayer only and we will do this from Tuesday 12th October.
