PARISH INFORMATION

Dear Friends,

After more than two weeks after reopening, it seems that the rate of new infection has been stabilised. Hence, the NSW Premier Dominic Perrotett has announced that from 8th November new density limits of one person per 2sq m will apply and congregational singing has been given the green light in places of worship. Wearing of masks indoors is still mandatory till 15th December. Christmas celebration looks possible at this point of time. Yet, we still need to be cautious when we gather in the church for worship.

Some of you may have heard about the Synod of Bishops in Rome scheduled for 2023. Parishioners have asked what the difference is between Plenary Council and the Synod of Bishops in Rome? Well, the Plenary addresses specific questions relating to the life and pastoral situation of the Church in Australia, while the Synod of Bishops discusses pastoral issues concerning the universal Church. Synod of Bishops, in the Roman Catholic Church, the institution of periodic meetings of bishops established in 1965 by Pope Paul VI. According to the "Decree on the Bishops' Pastoral Office in the Church" issued by the Second Vatican Council, the synod is convoked by the Pope with the intention of assisting in Church government and of demonstrating the responsibility of bishops as a body for the universal Church in addition to their individual responsibility in their respective dioceses.

Pope Francis, however, modifies the process of decision making. Pope Francis and the bishops must listen not just to the faithful, but also to those who are on the margin or even outside of the Church. Hence, he encourages all people to speak loudly and boldly. Practically, Pope Francis said, this means not entering the discussion with the idea that there will be "winners" who get their way and "losers" who do not, but leaving agendas at the door, speaking with *parrhesia* (a Greek word that appears in the New Testament and means "frankness," "boldness" or "courage"), listening humbly and being open to others' ideas. In theory, no topic is off-limits, and disagreement is welcome.

By pulling the entire Church into this participative process, Pope Francis aims to give Catholics an experience of a Church that comes together instead of fragmenting, that discerns together instead of making decrees in isolation and that walks together (how the verbal form of the Greek word for "synod" is used in the New Testament). It is different from what most Catholics are used to, and by its nature involves disagreement. But it also involves mutual listening, courage, humility and respect— all virtues that today's Church could stand to grow in.

When speaking about the renewal of the Church, Pope Francis often alludes to the image of a dream. In the Old Testament, prophets encountered God in a dream. Guided by the Holy Spirit, Pope Francis portrays a path that renews the Church and indeed the whole human society for a better future. Indeed, Pope Francis invites and encourages us share to this dream, particular in a time full of uncertainties: "This is a moment to dream big, to rethink our priorities—what we value, what we want, what we seek—and to commit to act in our daily life on what we have dreamed of." In his characteristically pastoral way, Francis urges us to move out of this current crisis by seeing, judging, and acting with the Holy Spirit, responding to God's ever-present challenge: "Dare to create something new."

In time of personal trial and crisis, let us confidently trust the Holy Spirit in the hope that "Where the danger is, there grows the saving power."

Have a wonderful weekend full of hopeful dreams. '

The pilgrimage will be held in Glenbrook, with overnight accommodation at St Finbar's Parish hall.

SEASON OF CREATION PILGRIMAGE 2022

The Season of Creation is the annual ecumenical, Christian celebration of prayer and action for God's creation - it starts on 1 September (the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation) and ends 4 October (Feast of St Francis). Pope Francis has encouraged Catholics around the world to embrace this opportunity to deepen our love for God and His creation, and to celebrate together with our Christian brothers and sisters from other denominations.

We are in very preliminary conversations with the Blue Mountains Deanery Council and the diocese about a Season of Creation Pilgrimage which might take place in the NSW Term 3 School Holidays (24 Sept - 9 Oct 2022: final pilgrimage dates TBC). Once again, we'll have more details about this later in the year and into 2022 - we'll keep you updated!


