Advent not just a time of waiting...
This weekend is the beginning of Advent which liturgically is time of awaiting for the birth of Jesus. Do you actually know why Advent is associated with the colour purple? In ancient times it was the colour of royalty because purple dye was costly and rare. So the liturgical colour of Advent is a symbol of looking forward to welcoming the coming of a King. Moreover, the Advent wreath and candles during Advent are a longstanding Catholic tradition that was originally adopted by Christians in the Middle Ages as part of their spiritual preparation for Christmas. The wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to the Christmas season. The wreath itself, which is made of various evergreens, signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life we find in Christ.
Hence Advent is not a passive waiting only. It is time of preparing the way for Christ's coming as well. In the Baby Jesus, God gave to us His best gift that He has: His Son for the salvation of the world. In return, we are called to bring joy to people's lives through our gifts. In these Advent days it echoes the challenge of John the Baptist to "prepare the way of the Lord" so all may see God's love.
Our faith and good deeds are pathways inviting Christ to enter into our lives. Hence, we are calling on you to assist the needy. You can donate food items to the House of St Francis in Granville which cares for the needy, especially the refugees. For further details, please refer to the parish bulletin. Commencing from this weekend, our Bishop Vincent also asks us to help him in caring for women and children who are homeless in our neighbourhood. Perhaps, this a good way to welcome Mary and the Baby Jesus by giving women and children a safe home and welcoming future.
