FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Second Sunday of Advent – Peace

The second candle of Advent represents the peace that Jesus' birth will bring into our world. We need peace because conflict is still a reality in the present day. We only need to look to Eastern Europe, Asia and the Middle East. The COVID-19 pandemic has accelerated and deepened this crisis. In response to the coronavirus pandemic, the UN Secretary-General António Guterres had appealed for an immediate global ceasefire, saying in March 2020: "Our world faces a common enemy: COVID-19. The virus does not care about nationality or ethnicity, faction or faith. It attacks all, relentlessly. Meanwhile armed conflict rages on around the world."

COVID-19 has also divided our nation. According to the *Australian Institute of Criminology* which surveyed 15,000 women from February to May, two thirds of women who experienced physical or sexual violence by a current or former cohabiting partner since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic said the violence had started or escalated in the three months prior to the survey. In other parts of the world the measures to contain the spread of COVID have led to an increase of human trafficking and sex slavery. To address their financial difficulties, parents often had no other choice than to sell their own children in exchange for "a cow or pig to ensure they have a livelihood."

Violence is the external manifestation of the person's inner conflict due to the COVID lockdowns and restrictions. Relationships have been unsettled. The second Sunday is a stark reminder of the urgent need for peace in our hearts and minds. Jesus brought about peace in the most unexpected ways when he arrived. The Jews, particularly the zealots, wanted a rebellion. They wanted their Saviour to overturn the oppressive rule of the Romans and bring about peace in a violent way. But Jesus had something else in mind. First he gives us inner peace. Because of his work on the cross, we have a chance to receive salvation and be indwelled by the Holy Spirit. This grants us an inner peace (John 14:27). Not only do we have the peace that comes from our assurance of salvation, but we also have the peace of mind knowing God will heal this broken world and will come again. Second, we have peace with others. We put aside our differences (Galatians 3:28), especially with other believers, because we belong to the same family. We have the same purpose: to let others know about the peace of Christ. The Hebrew word for peace: Shalom, goes far beyond not fighting with others or peace as we know it. Shalom is, in essence, how things are meant to be: a slice of heaven. The peace of God allows us to look at others through heaven's eyes and help guide the world to see God's here and not-yet here kingdom. Peace from God, biblical peace, allows us to trust in God's promises (Proverbs 3:5) through restful tranquil faith, despite the dark scary world around us.

Instead of conflicts and wars with others and ourselves, Pope Francis calls us to foster a "culture of care by advancing on the path of fraternity, justice and peace between individuals, communities, peoples and nations ... a common, supportive and inclusive commitment to protecting and promoting the dignity and good of all, a willingness to show care and compassion, to work for reconciliation and healing, and to advance mutual respect and acceptance."

Let us pray for this peace: Father, this second week of Advent, keep us in perfect peace as our mind is stayed on the truth of your powerful love. Thank you for your mighty, sovereign hand. Help us to trust fully in you and rest in the peace that you offer. It's in the precious name of Jesus we pray. Amen.


CHRISTMAS CARDS:

PARISH FINANCE COMMITTEE (PFC)

The PFC met last week to monitor the parish finances and to advise Fr Joe on related matters. Items of interest include the following:

- The Diocesan quota for our parish for the current financial year has been set at a little over \$18,000 We are asked to raise this money from the various appeals that will be held during the year to assist the Diocese to fund CatholicCare Social Services, the Ephpheta Centre, the Holy Spirit Seminary and other similar works.
- The parish is investigating the possible use of the original church building for use as a women's refuge, as part of the parish outreach to the community.
- Our grant application for a hall kitchen upgrade was unsuccessful. Fr Joe has submitted another grant application to install ceiling fans in the hall and to upgrade other items.
- The parish finances are in a good state at the moment and all those who continue to generously contribute are sincerely thanked. Our continued use of envelopes for the second collection is costly, and parishioners who are able, are encouraged to donate electronically. Information on how to do this can be obtained from the parish office.
- The Parish needs two more PFC members. If you are interested please speak to Fr Joe.


