FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Gaudete Sunday

As we enter the third week of Advent, the change of colour from violet to rose-coloured vestments signals a change of spirit as well: The *Gaudete* Sunday therefore, makes a break about midway through a season which is otherwise of a penitential character, and signifies the nearness of the Lord's coming. The readings also reflect this joyful spirit. Zechariah spoke about how God rejoices and showers his people with gladness because He is near (second reading). Hence *Gaudete* Sunday is further marked by a new *Invitatory*, the <u>Church</u> no longer inviting the <u>faithful</u> to adore merely "The Lord who is to come", but calling upon them to worship and hail with joy "The Lord who is now nigh and close at hand".

Looking at the hustle and bustle of our daily life, it appears that this joy may be far from our current concern. Rather, our worries are the gifts we need to purchase for our family and friends. What stresses us is the fact that our family and friends have expectations which we try to fulfill: wishes for certain gifts, wrappings, food, or decorations. Then, there are holidays we need to plan for. An average family will spend an average of 1,232 AUD for Christmas. Nearly a quarter of Australian households will go into debt to fund their spending. We are afraid to disappoint our family and friends.

This Sunday is an invitation to us to rejoice and be glad because God is about to give us the best gift He can ever afford: The gift of His Son. The real message of Christmas is not the gifts that we give to each other. Rather it is a reminder of the gift that God has given to each of us. It is the only gift that truly keeps on giving. God's gift came to us in the humblest of wrappings. His gift tells us something about the giver. When you want to give someone a gift, you start thinking about it ahead of time. Hopefully you try to find what that person wants or needs.

When God decided to give us the gift of eternal life, it wasn't something that He just thought of on the fly. Long before there was a town called Bethlehem, a garden called Eden, and a planet called Earth, a decision was made in eternity that God would send forth His Son, born of a woman, made under the law, to redeem those that are under the law.

Let us rejoice in this greatest gift ever made to humanity. Before you go shopping, just gift yourselves with some precious time of prayers and silence reflecting on God's gift to you and your family. We have daily Masses and rosary prayers. Every Friday at 7.30pm, there is a Eucharistic adoration. So visit the church first and then go to Westfield – would this not be something that you would consider this week?


