FR JOE'S MUSINGS

This weekend we welcome home both Fr Joe and Deacon Andrew from their respective holidays. We hope you both had a good break and are ready to tackle the affairs of the parish.

We are also saddened by the death of our long term parishioner Reg Moore, who was dedicated to this parish and was very generous with his time fixing whatever needed to be fixed, but was mostly seen climbing on roofs. We ask that God has mercy on his soul, and we pray for his wife Margaret and their family.

Our readings this weekend give affirmation to the sacrament of Holy Matrimony. The reading from Isaiah compares Yahweh to a young man who marries a virgin. His love transforms her. She used to be called "forsaken" by society at the time, but this changed to "my delight". Likewise, the Gospel reading from St John shows Christ's approval of marriage as He accedes to the request of Mary and performs His first miracle by changing water into wine.

There are many lessons we can learn from the Gospel reading today, including the following:

- Christ became man to redeem us, but He is also interested in our so many and varied activities during the course of our journey to heaven. Thus, when we pray, we should not hesitate to make known to Him our temporal as well as our spiritual needs. Remember He said, "ask and you shall receive", and we should expect to be granted all our requests provided they will not impede us on our journey to heaven.
- We also learn from this reading that Christians are meant to enjoy life. Our Christian religion is a religion of joy. Thus, we see Christ enjoying the village wedding with friends and then turning all six water pots into good quality wine. Each pot could hold about 750 litres that is an awful lot of wine, and so it would have been a very joyful wedding!
- This miracle also demonstrates Christ's generosity to His friend by saving him from the embarrassment of running out of wine at his own wedding. Christ will be just as generous to you and me if only we remember to ask Him.
- The intercessory power of Mary, our blessed Mother is also shown here. It was through her sensitive awareness that she asked Jesus to sort out the problem with the wine. We should ask her everyday to intercede for us with Christ Jesus and ask Him to grant our requests.

May God protect us all from COVID as we negotiate these difficult times together.
