FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Welcome back and Welcome home

Some will regret that the holiday month of January is over because they have to return to work. Others are quite happy for the ending of January because holidays can be exhausting. They are looking to have their children return to schools so they can enjoy their work. Yet parents may be anxious too because of the evolving situation of Omicron. The question: Will we ever be able to have complete safety? I can only pray that all teachers, children, employees, and parents stay safe. I would like to welcome our teachers, employees, and students back to our school. I hope that you have a safe and good school year.

The return of the school means also that our parish life resumes its "normality". During the holidays I had time to make some parish appointments for 2022. I am happy to announce that Annemaree Baird and Jessica Doherty have taken on the role of sacramental coordinators for 2022. Annemaree will be responsible for the Holy Communion, while Jessica will coordinate the sacrament of Confirmation. Peter McMahon and I will help children with the sacrament of Reconciliation. I also have reversed the sacramental curriculum: The Holy Communion will take place prior to the sacrament of Confirmation. This step makes sense given the fact that Confirmation is the sacrament that strengthen teenagers to live as Christians consciously and intentionally. It means that those who have received the Holy Communion last year will join those children who will undertake the sacrament of Confirmation in September. This means that the Confirmation this year will be quite big in numbers. I would like to thank Annemaree and Jessica for their commitment of faith. Likewise, I am grateful to Julie-Ann and Jim who have spearheaded the sacramental programs over many years. Their faith commitment has brought the sacraments to many children of our parish.

The Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Finance Committee are currently reviewing their membership and structure. There are some vacancies to be filled. After many years as chair of the PPC, Vince Dobson has decided to step down in favour of the election of a new chair. Vince will remain as member of the PPC. Thank you Vince, for your generosity and love for our parish. Hopefully this process will be complete soon. The Liturgy Committee will also welcome new members. Geraldine Agahari has been appointed to the Liturgy Committee. Terry Keogh has resigned for the chair of the committee due to ill health. He will remain as a member. Thank you Terry for your commitment. Due to his new employment in QLD, Matthew Philips has temporarily ceased with his music ministry in our parish. I am sure we will see him again. Thank you Matthew and God bless for your next phase of life.

We still need volunteers for live streaming and IT, music, and catechetical instruction in public schools. These are important ministries that assist people to celebrate the sacraments and encounter God through the Bible.

The Local Plenary has now finished the consultation process. It appears that the theme "Community-building" is one principal outcome. Martin Rogers, leader of the Local Plenary, will summarise the process for us and present it to the PPC for its implementation. Thank you, Martin for your hard work. 


