FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Late have I loved You...

Some of you may have heard about Saint Augustine who had lived in the fourth century and was considered the arguably greatest theologian of the early Church. He wrote his "Confessions" in 398 AD describing the path that led him to become a Christian in 387 AD. Reflecting on the sins of his early life and his reluctance to accept Christ, he wrote about his final deliverance through God's intervention: "Late have I loved you, beauty so old and so new: late have I loved you. And see, you were within and I was in the external world and sought you there, and in my unlovely state I plunged into those lovely created things which you made. You were with me, and I was not with you. The lovely things kept me far from you, though if they did not have their existence in you, they had no existence at all. You called and cried out loud and shattered my deafness. You were radiant and resplendent, you put to flight my blindness. You were fragrant, and I drew in my breath and now pant after you. I tasted you, and I feel but hunger and thirst for you. You touched me, and I am set on fire to attain the peace which is yours."

The Gospel of this Sunday reminds us that it is never too late to make a U-turn and to return to God who is always with us, even though we were not all the time with Him. We know all too well that we can't avoid the crap of life, but (at the risk of sounding cliched) we can grow through it. We, the weak, we, the weary and vulnerable. We can grow through the crap and come to respond to tragedy – be it natural disaster or criminal activity or the threatened deportation of a friend – not with fear but with compassion and action, so that we become the sort of hard-nosed but soft-hearted, battle-scarred, long-suffering, persevering, ever-loving, non-judgmental, nurturing, fruit-bearing people that God requires.

Hence, Lent is a time for good deeds. If we remain focus on the good things, we have no time for deeds of evil. If we concentrate on the grace of God that is within us, we no longer waste our talents for bad things. Augustine writes: "It is from God's goodness that kind actions spring."

This week we can do two good things for our neighbour and for ourselves:

- 1) On Sunday 20th at 11.30 am at our neighbouring Baptist church, let us join our Christian sisters and brothers in Glenbrook and share a soup with each other in solidarity with those who experience little goodness of life. While fasting with Jesus who refused to have his fill to be with those who are hungry, we can help *GATEWAY Family Services* charity in Blaxland.
- 2) Tuesday 22 at 7pm (Parish Hall), Sr Dr Margaret Ghosn, Principal of the Maronite College in Harris Park and Lecturer in biblical theology, will present a talk on the *Crucifixion and Death of Jesus according to Luke*. This talk may help us to understand the love and sacrifice of Jesus for us.

Invitation to St Finbar's Passover Meal Tuesday, 12 April 2022, 6.30pm



The Gospel accounts of Jesus' Last Supper closely align with the traditional Passover celebration. In the Gospel of Luke, we read:

Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. So, Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat it." (Luke 22:7-8)

Jesus and the apostles observed the Passover as it likely was practiced among firstcentury Jews, but his additional words and actions inspirited the Passover with his
own life and the promise of salvation. In Acts 20:1-7, it is mentioned that Paul was
keeping the festival of unleavened bread with the believers there. When we celebrate
Jesus' Passover Meal, we recall the history of salvation that God has offered to all
of us from the very beginning of creation. The Passover is a memorial of the
redemption of the Exodus from Egypt and rejoicing in God's salvation. This event
can draw Jews and Christians closer to one another.

The Passover meal begins at 6.30 pm in the Parish Hall. It encompasses various Food rituals including the blessing of bread and multiple cups of wine (or cups of grape juice), bitter herbs, eggs and roasted Lamb and baked potatoes, salads and veggies (as mains).

Cost: 12 AUD per adult, and 8 AUD per child, or 50 AUD per family.
