FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday

On Sunday 3rd July, we celebrate National Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Sunday, a day when the Australian Catholic Bishops and our National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council invite us to give thanks for the gifts that our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples bring to our Church and our nation and to reflect on our journey together.

Hence, we acknowledge that Darug and Gundungurra Traditional Owners have a continuous and deep connection to their Country and that this is of great cultural significance to Aboriginal people, both locally and in the region.

The Gospel of this Sunday speaks about the rich harvest and about the labourers that God will send to the fields. Hence the evangelist Luke recognises the importance of the care for the land and soil as well. We are reminded of our responsibility for the earth and for its ecological sustainability. As a result, the PPC has taken an important to step to register St Finbar's as a Catholic Earthcare Parish. I invite you to enter into an ecological dialogue with the purpose to care for our common home. The overall theme of the Gospel of this Sunday is the hospitality that God offers to all creatures. The ancient custom of hospitality revolved around the practice of welcoming strangers or travellers into one's home while promising to provide them with provisions and protection. Luke's emphasis on hospitality can be found in three passages that are unique to his work: Luke 10:1-16, Luke 24:13-35, and Acts 9:43-10:48. In essence, Jesus forbids his disciples from evaluating their hosts based on the status they hold in society. To carry out their mission properly, Jesus' disciples must form deep and loyal bonds with those whom they encounter along the way. Christian guests cannot constantly be looking for better offers and more advantageous hosts.

The burning question in this passage is: Why does Jesus take on the form of a stranger? Hospitality becomes the vehicle through which the evangelization and incorporation of the Gentiles into the life of the Christian community are first realized. Hence, Luke creates a direct link between the custom of hospitality, which bridges the gap between people of different regions and cultures in antiquity, and the integration of the Gentiles into the life of the Church. Jesus' disciples must not allow cultural differences (e.g., food laws) to blind them to the work of God. The cross-cultural practice of hospitality provides an ideal vehicle for sharing the gospel with unbelievers and unifying the Christian Church despite its disparate membership. By entering into an alliance or covenant with those from cultures that are foreign to them, Jesus' disciples are forced both to give and to receive benefits from those God has called them to love. Acts 9:43- 10:48 demonstrates how they are to function as host and guest in a reciprocal hospitality relationship.


Peter moves seamlessly from guest to host and back to guest again while God provides the "gift" that seals the permanent relationship among those who worship him.

These Lukan hospitality texts remain relevant for Christians today. Even more than in the ancient world, we encounter travellers and strangers from vastly different regions and cultures. Some are traveling by choice (e.g., students and immigrants), while others travel by necessity (e.g., evacuees from natural disasters and refugees from war-torn regions). In Luke's writings, we hear a call to extend hospitality to these strangers in creative ways.

At St Finbar's we are currently in dialogue with Bishop Vincent, whose vision of welcoming the refugees seems to reflect the Lukan hospitality, to convert the independent living unit in the presbytery to offer hospitality to refugees who live in our local community.

FORMATION FOR MISSION AND MISSION ENGAGEMENT

The Second Assembly of the Plenary Council, to be held in Sydney, begins with the Opening Mass this Sunday 3 July. Over the next six days, the 277 Plenary Council members will consider the motions that have emerged from the national journey which aims to renew the life and mission of the Church in Australia.

The strength of the Plenary Council, which aims to discern what the Holy Spirit is saying, has come from the support of the Catholic community in Australia. Our parishes and parishioners have played an intrinsic role, contributing valuable input throughout the discernment process and the First Assembly. Now there are still opportunities to be involved, through prayer, following the events of the Second Assembly, and sending messages of support to the Members of the Plenary Council.

Opportunities for parishioner involvement

Prayer: Parish communities are encouraged to pray the Plenary Council prayer for the Diocese of Parramatta which was developed by the Members of the Plenary Council.

Follow the livestreams: A livestream will take place each day from the Plenary Council from 8.30am 4 to 8 July, and 9am on 8 July. The daily Masses will also be livestreamed.

Direct messages to the members: The Plenary Council will feature a message board at the assembly venue where Members can read the prayers, hope and messages of support from parishioners around Australia.

Attend the closing Mass: The Catholic community is invited to attend the closing Mass of the Second Assembly on Saturday 9 July at 10.30 am at St Mary's Cathedral.
