FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Historic and Landmark Decisions?

After a long week of debates and controversies, the Fifth Australian Plenary Council concluded on the 9^{th of} July 2022 with a Solemn Mass at St Mary's Cathedral in Sydney. During the week, the Plenary has made headlines because it failed to endorse the equal right of women. In his reflection, Archbishop Fisher described the Plenary as "a week of positives and negatives", while other Bishops quickly labelled the Plenary week as historic and hailed its landmark decisions that would have great impact not only the Church in Australia, but also for every parish: "Australia's historic Plenary Council assembly – the first in more than 80 years – has voted to promote the role of women in the Church, including motions that could lead the country changing existing decision-making structures, and accepting women deacons." (Catholic Leader, Brisbane).

According to the Archbishop of Sydney, there was an under presentation of "ordinary Catholics that was also potentially distorting". There were around 17,000 submissions by 220,000 Catholics. This means that less than 5% of the total Catholic population in Australia participated in the Plenary process.

In my view, it comes down to the sole question: What is the Church? It is still a Sacrament of Christ: "The Church, in Christ, is like a Sacrament — a sign and instrument, that is, of communion with God and of unity among all people.' (CCC, no. 775) Or, is it just the People of God?

As a Theologian, I will not join and share the Plenary's enthusiasm yet. Paul's advice is my guide in this regard: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Rom 12:2) Here, Paul used the Greek word *euareston* to define what is to be considered good: "By *euareston* (acceptable) he underlines the fact that the goodness which is in question is no anthropocentric goodness but a goodness determined by the revelation of God's will, a matter of obedience to God's commandments." When Paul says that we should be transformed in the renewal of our minds so that we can discern and do what is the will of God, he means the revealed will of God and its proper applications to life. *He does not mean: try to figure out God's sovereign plan and do it.* That is God's secret. We are to do his revealed will and leave the sovereign running of the universe to him.

The future will tell whether the Plenary was conducted with obedience to the Will of God, or whether it was done with a political intention to replace God's sovereign plan with that of human idea!

However, 18 children together with their parents have discerned in the last 5 weeks about the unconditional love of God. They are now ready to receive for the first time the Body and Blood of Christ on this Sunday 17/7 during the 9.30am Mass.

I would like to thank *Annemaree Baird* for her leadership in accompanying our children through the catechetical preparation.

Take a look at our newly upgraded Mandatory Safeguarding Training Platform...

Would you like to complete your Mandatory or Elective Safeguarding Modules independently and at times convenient to you? Our newly upgraded online training platform is now live.

If you haven't had a chance as yet, you can access the LearnWorlds platform

at: https://learning.safeguarding.org.au

On this platform you are able to register yourself and choose the Safeguarding Modules that are relevant to you. The three mandatory modules [Compliance Training – tagged gold] are:

Understanding Safeguarding and the Child Safe Standards

Legal Compliance and Safeguarding: Risk of Significant Harm and Reportable Conduct

Working with Adults at Risk and Understanding Boundaries

Existing users may have received a Welcome courtesy email from the platform. Mandatory Training is valid for two years. There is no need to review previously completed modules unless you wish to push your renewal date further back. Those with coordinator and leadership roles within the parish are also asked to complete two elective modules. You will find these Leadership Elective Modules tagged blue on the platform.

New users are invited to 'sign up' onto the platform using their unique email address, identifying their parish and naming their role in the parish. Once logged into the platform, click on the 'Modules' link to locate the mandatory compliance modules as well as the elective modules. Click on 'Enrol' to begin each module.
