FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Welcome Home

We all welcome you back home to Glenbrook, Fr Joe, after your holiday in Germany, France and other places. We are delighted that you got to see your family and visit the grave of your mother.

Although we were well looked after by Fr Bob, Fr John and Fr Paul during your absence, we are delighted that you have returned to us, and we look forward to working with you again as our Parish Priest.

With the return of Fr Joe, our weekday Mass schedule will return to a regular Mass every morning, Tuesday to Saturday, at 9:15am.

Twenty-First Sunday of Ordinary Time

In the Gospel of today's Mass we are reminded that we must never lose sight of the reason we were placed on this earth – the salvation of our immortal souls. In the hustle and bustle of our very busy lives, it is easy to ignore our salvation, or at least give it a low priority. In Luke's Gospel we are warned that this is not good enough. Our salvation must be front and centre in all we do.

Jesus does not even bother to reply to the question about how many will be saved. He prefers to talk of more relevant issues, like the need to choose well, even in difficult circumstances. Jesus warns us off any false sense of entitlement: Jesus is not obliged to save us. What matters most is being with the Master at all times and involving Him in all we say and do. Take up the cross and follow Him every day of our lives. This is how we will enter through the narrow door.

Jesus also does not answer the question of who will be saved. He simply invites us to be wary of judging others, and to believe that salvation is available to all. This is emphasised in the first reading from Isaiah who quotes the Lord as saying that He is coming to gather the nations of every language.

What can we do in our own lives to ensure our salvation? Salvation depends on whether or not we "know" Jesus. Simply claiming to have spent some time with him is not really enough. We need to commit to loving Him more and more every day, and to loving our neighbour as well. It might be a matter of regular prayers every morning. You might be able to come to Mass one weekday every week. You might be able to give to the poor or respond to their needs in some other way. Whatever you choose to do, take a positive step to do God's will every day of your life.
