FR JOE'S MUSINGS

"Late have I loved You, my God..."

This weekend is a big one for the Augustinians. On Saturday, we celebrate the feast day of St Augustine, arguably the greatest theologian in the Early church. On Sunday, we celebrate St Monica, the mother of St Augustine. Augustine is regarded as a person who struggled with the faith and who only after a long and difficult journey found the faith in Jesus Christ. Once touched by Christ, he acclaimed: "Late have I loved you, beauty so old and so new: late have I loved you. And see, you were within, and I was in the external world and sought you there, and in my unlovely state I plunged into those lovely created things which you made. You were with me, and I was not with you. The lovely things kept me far from you, though if they did not have their existence in you, they had no existence at all. You called and cried out loud and shattered my deafness. You were radiant and resplendent, you put to flight my blindness. You were fragrant, and I drew in my breath and now pant after you. I tasted you, and I feel but hunger and thirst for you. You touched me, and I am set on fire to attain the peace which is yours."

Monica represents a woman whose faith was unwavering. It was her faith that accompanies her son's dark time. Augustine wrote that his mother "strove in every way" to raise him up to experience the love of God. Monica's steadfast love and faith reminds me of my beloved mother whose grave I was privileged to see while on my annual leave in Germany this year.

Returning to Australia, I see that things went very well here at St Finbar's. Next year, I will take a longer leave knowing that St Finbar's can flourish without the Parish Priest.

May I take this opportunity to acknowledge the work of our parish staff, Peter, Juliana, Ros, and Jean. I also found that the church's and presbytery's ground are impeccable. So, thank you all for your hard work and commitment. A big thank goes also to Frs Bob, John, Michael and Paul who celebrated the liturgy and sacraments for us while I was on my annual leave.

You all truly live by this saying: "The highest form of worship is the worship of unselfish Christian service."

We are currently investigating possibilities to make our Parish more energy sufficient. One important measure is to install batteries to store the solar energy from the solar panels. This will reduce the cost over the years. The batteries will cost at a price of 17,000. Any donation is very welcome.

25 children are currently preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Please pray for them and for Jessica and Patrick Doherty who take on the task of accompanying them on this journey of faith.

September will be a busy month, with various formation programs in our parish. Please have a look on our September program and see whether there is something for you.

We also congratulate Fr Andrew Rooney who was ordained to the priesthood last Friday at the Cathedral in Parramatta by Bishop Vincent. We will have Andrew with us later for a thanksgiving Mass.


