FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Christ, the King

Essentially a magnification of the Feast of the Ascension, the Solemnity of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Originally it was celebrated on the last Sunday in October, but in the revised liturgical calendar promulgated by Pope Paul VI in 1969 it was moved to the last Sunday of Ordinary Time (immediately preceding Advent), where its theme of Christ's dominion over all aspects of our lives made it a fitting end to the liturgical year. The festival is also observed in Lutheran, Anglican, and other Protestant churches.

Why is it so important today? What does the "Power" of Christ consist in? It is not the power of the kings or the great people of this world; it is the divine power to give eternal life, to liberate from evil, to defeat the dominion of death. It is the power of Love that can draw good from evil, that can melt a hardened heart, bring peace amid the harshest conflict and kindle hope in the thickest darkness. This Kingdom of Grace is never imposed and always respects our freedom. Christ came "to bear witness to the truth" (Jn 18: 37), as he declared to Pilate: whoever accepts his witness serves beneath his "banner."

Every conscience, therefore, must make a choice. Choosing Christ does not guarantee success according to the world's criteria but assures the peace and joy that he alone can give us. This is demonstrated, in every epoch, by the experience of numerous men and women who, in Christ's name, in the name of truth and justice, were able to oppose the enticements of earthly powers with their different masks, to the point that they sealed their fidelity with martyrdom.

This Sunday 20th November at 9.30am Mass, we will joyfully receive Kate, David, Amy, Chloe and Oliver into the full communion with the Catholic church. By the grace of God and help of the Holy Spirit, they have freely chosen to be members of the Catholic Church. We thank them for their faith and commitment. I hope that they find at St Finbar's a welcoming place and nourishing community. Thank you also to Margaret Richards and Peter Brown who have accompanied and prepared them for this celebration.

Fr Andrew Rooney who, as a Deacon, has ministered here at St Finbar from November 2021 to May 2022, will celebrate his Thanksgiving Mass on 27th November at 9.30am. Please join Fr Andrew in this celebration and give thanks and praise to God for Fr Andrew's priestly ministry.

On the same Sunday, 27th November at 5.30pm, Seminarian Tom Green will be ordained to the Deaconate by Bishop Vincent Long OFMConv. in Blacktown (Mary, Queen of the Family Parish). Tom's parents live in Blaxland and his brother Jack Green is a priest of our diocese. Jack is currently undertaking his post-graduate studies at the University of Oxford. Tom has extended his invitation to all parishioners to attend his ordination.
