FR JOE'S MUSINGS

What has the Year of the CAT to do with Aboriginal Sunday?

To us Westerners, Chinese New Year is often seen as the same everywhere, in any Asian country with Lunar Calendar, and to be honest it is not completely wrong! The general atmosphere is similar no matter if you celebrate it in China, Korea, Taiwan, Singapore or Vietnam. While there are a lot of commonalities, there is a difference. On the first day, Vietnamese usually visit their parents on the husband's side; on the second day they visit their parents on the wife's side; and lastly, they spend their third day of Tet visiting their teachers. Instead of the Chinese Year of the Rabbit, Vietnam is celebrating the Year of the CAT on 22/1. For this occasion, I was able to acquire a traditional Vietnamese Hoa Mai New Year (called also Tet in Vietnamese), now in our church. Here is the explanation of its meaning: The Yellow Hoa Mai blossom is considered the quintessential symbol of spring. In southern Vietnam, Hoa Mai are some of the first plants to flower. As a result, they are seen as the embodiment of Tet.

But that's only half the story. Each part of Hoa Mai also carries meaning. The individual petals, for instance, stand for one of five blessings: longevity, wealth, peace, health and love of virtues. And the colour yellow represents happiness, prosperity and good luck. The red (colour of luck) envelopes are filled with money and symbolize good wishes and luck for the new year ahead. Red firecrackers are to be set off in order to scare away evil spirits and to signal the start of a safe and prosperous new year.

So, I wish you all a good, healthy and prosperous New Year! The Vietnamese New Year also coincides with Aboriginal Sunday. On January 26, 1938, Aboriginal leaders including William Cooper invited Australian churches to set aside the Sunday to act in solidarity with Aboriginal peoples and the injustices being experienced. In the Catholic church however, the official Aboriginal and Torres Straight Islanders Sunday is scheduled every year on the first Sunday of July, followed by NAIDOC which celebrates the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Lately, I have read a magnificent book "People of the River. Lost worlds of early Australia" (published in 2020) by Prof. Grace Karskens who uncovers the everyday lives of ordinary people

on *Dyarubbin*, the Hawkesbury-Nepean River, in the early colony, both Aboriginal and British. By reading *People of the River*, people will learn why this forgotten farming society was so pivotal to the early Sydney colony, and why it remains important and relevant today. Karskens finds a highly engaging way to bring Dyarubbin – the river and its Aboriginal and immigrant communities – alive. She draws on past scholarship and meticulous new research, merging environmental, archaeological, historical, linguistic and Aboriginal perspectives. This allows her to switch effectively between the large scale and personal stories, which mean we never lose sight of the people on the ground.

As you know the Prime Minister Anthony Albanese aims for a referendum that envisages a change of the *Constitution* to constitutionally establish an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander **Voice**. I am not a politician and, as a permanent resident in Australia (Germany does not allow DUAL citizenship), I am not permitted to act politically. As Australians, however, the referendum will have an impact on all of you since it is related to the Australian Constitution. Hence, may I invite you to engage in this process with a respectful, informed and discerning spirit for the benefit and prosperity of all Australians.

CARDINAL PELL'S FUNERAL The Catholic

Archdiocese of Sydney has announced a Pontifical Requiem Mass for Cardinal George Pell AC will be held at St Mary's Cathedral on Thursday 2 February at 11am. Cardinal Pell passed away on 10 January in Rome. He was 81. Cardinal Pell's successor as Archbishop of Sydney, Most Rev. Anthony Fisher OP will be the Principal Celebrant at the Requiem Mass, following which the Cardinal will be buried privately in the St Mary's Cathedral crypt. Cathedral Dean, Father Don Richardson said thousands of mourners are expected to attend the Mass. "Cardinal Pell left a remarkable legacy for the Catholic Church in Australia, and this will undoubtedly be one of the most significant funerals ever held at the Cathedral", he said.

"Cardinal Pell was also known and highly respected by many overseas due to his numerous roles in the Vatican over many decades. The Mass will be livestreamed on the St Mary's Cathedral YouTube Channel to allow overseas mourners to participate in the ceremony. Screens will be erected in the St Mary's Cathedral forecourt to accommodate the large numbers of mourners expected to attend and pay their respects to the deceased cardinal who served as Archbishop of Sydney from 2001-2014.

For mourners unable to attend the Funeral Mass on the 2nd February, there will be a Masses for the late Cardinal at St Mary's Cathedral on Wednesday 1 February at 1:10pm and 8pm. There will also be Evening Prayer on Wednesday 1 February at 5:30pm.

Cardinal Pell will lie in state at St Mary's Cathedral from 9:30am on Wednesday 1 February.


