FR JOE'S MUSINGS

I am not coming to abolish, but to fulfill...

When I was a student in the seminary, a fellow seminarian, who wasn't sure about a priestly life in celibacy, said to me that he hoped that one day the Pope would lift this obligation and allow priests to be married. It would make his choice easier, he sighed. Anyway, it does not seem that the priestly celibacy will be abandoned soon, even under the pontificate of Pope Francis.

This was the attitude of the a few in the community of Matthew. Some thought that Jesus was going to create a community free of obligation. Instead, Matthew puts emphasis on Jesus coming to complete and not to abolish the law. To hammer his point home, Matthew even went a step further by saying that the members of his community must surpass the Pharisees and Scribes in good works. If they say YES to Christ, then they can't just be a people "YES and NO" people, undecided in their commitment. Hence, the faith in Jesus Christ is a straightforward one because later on Matthew points to the nature of the Law of Christ: The heart of the Law was and is: "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind... and your neighbour as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-39).

Jesus wants listening hearts, courageous, generous, and discerning hearts like his. Are you ever called to be prophetic by rising above peer pressure and speaking the truth in your heart? End your prayer with the writer of the Psalms: "Make me know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation." (Psalm 25:4-5).

Our faith commitment must include the care of those who live in disadvantageous situations. In our country, we need to reach out to our First Nations sisters and brothers. The current situation in Alice Springs is a stark reminder that there are lots needing to be done. And we need to do so in Truth and Discernment, not just following politics. This is very important at a time when we are called to a referendum to give VOICE to our First Nations People. Perhaps, you might be interested in doing an online course called "NATSICC Cross Cultural Competency in a Catholic Context" organised by Catholic Religious Australia, the bulk organisation of all religious congregations in Australia.

Another problem in our community is the care for those who suffer domestic violence in various forms. I hope that the diocese will accept our offer of using our independent unit to provide for relief accommodation for those experiencing domestic violence.

Lastly, we also need to welcome those who are estranged from the Church and Faith that may not be their own making, but a result of the treatment they received from the Church communities. How can we listen to their concerns is the most important issue.

PARISH QR CODE

- The OR code is made available during the event for participants to donate/pay using their mobile phone
- The parishioner running the event is responsible for the safe return of both the QR code and the folder to the parish office.
