FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Christ is Risen. AND so we are too!

Before I am accused of blasphemy or impiety for saying "We are risen" after "Christ is risen," please hear me out. I don't in any way intend to demean the unique, universe-transforming resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Christian life is centred in the extraordinary good news of Easter: Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! The resurrection changes everything.



Christ's resurrection is the central event of Christianity, a fundamental truth that must be always reaffirmed with vigor, as to deny it in different ways, as has been attempted and continues to be attempted, or to transform it into a merely spiritual event is to make our faith vain. "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:14).

But, if we take seriously the impact and implications of the resurrection, then we can and should affirm something beyond "Christ is risen." This additional affirmation depends for its validity on the fact of the resurrection of Jesus. Moreover, it stands on the bedrock of biblical revelation, especially as found in Ephesians 2:1-7. This passage reveals that we were once "dead in [our] transgressions and sins" (2:1). But God, because of his great love, mercy, and grace, "made us alive with Christ" (2:5). Moreover, God also "raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus" (2:6). God raised us up with Christ. Therefore, in a sense, we are risen.

Our resurrection today is part of the "already and not yet" experience of God's future kingdom that is coming and yet also here with us now. Though we have not been fully and finally raised from the dead, through Christ and in his Spirit, we begin to experience the reality of the resurrection now.

Thus, in the season of Easter, we do not simply look back to the resurrection of Jesus and marvel, though awestruck worship is certainly merited. Rather, we also look toward the future, yearning for the day when we will be completely raised into the peace of God's kingdom. And during Eastertide, we also look at our own lives to see if we are living each day as people who have begun to experience resurrection. Are we people of strong faith? Do we see in our lives the very power that raised Christ from the dead? Are we full of hope, even in the midst of struggles and sufferings? Is there evidence of the new creation in our daily lives, our work, our dreams, our relationships, our citizenship?



If Christ is truly risen, and if we have put our trust in him, then we also have been raised with him. So, Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! We are risen! We are risen, indeed and in part!

Just as the sun's rays in springtime cause the buds on the branches of the trees to sprout and open up, so the radiance that streams forth from Christ's Resurrection gives strength and meaning to every human hope, to every expectation, wish and plan. Hence the entire cosmos is rejoicing today, caught up in the springtime of humanity, which gives voice to creation's silent hymn of praise. The Easter *Alleluia*, resounding in the Church as she makes her pilgrim way through the world,



expresses the silent exultation of the universe and above all the longing of every human soul that is sincerely open to God, giving thanks to him for his infinite goodness, beauty and truth.

May the Land which was the first to be flooded by the light of the Risen One rejoice. May the splendour of Christ reach the peoples of the Middle East, so that the light of peace and of human dignity may overcome the darkness of division, hate and violence. In the current conflict in Ukraine, may diplomacy and dialogue take the place of arms and may those who suffer as a result of the conflict be given access to humanitarian aid. In the countries of northern Africa, may all citizens, especially young people, work to promote the common good and to build a society where poverty is defeated and every political choice is inspired by respect for the human person. May help come from all sides to those fleeing conflict and to refugees from various African countries who have been obliged to leave all that is dear to them; may people of good will open their hearts to welcome them, so that the pressing needs of so many brothers and sisters will be met with a concerted response in a spirit of solidarity; and may our words of comfort and appreciation reach all those who make such generous efforts and offer an exemplary witness in this regard.

On this Day of the Lord's resurrection, let us also not forget to pray for our parishioners and loved ones who have returned to the Lord. May the resurrection also be granted to them.

The risen Christ is journeying ahead of us towards the new heavens and the new earth (cf. Rev 21, 1), in which we shall all finally live as one family, as sons of the same Father. He is with us until the end of time. Let us walk behind him, in this wounded world, singing Alleluia. In our hearts there is joy and sorrow, on our faces there are smiles and tears. Such is our earthly reality. But Christ is risen, he is alive and he walks with us. For this reason, we sing and we walk, faithfully carrying out our task in this world with our gaze fixed on Heaven.

Together with the PPC, PFC and Juliana and Peter may I wish you a wonderful and glory filled Easter.


