Diocesan Synod?

In March 2023, Bishop Vincent announced and convoked a Diocesan Synod for October 2023. We may wonder what a Diocesan Synod is. "Synod" simply means "meeting." While meetings happen regularly in diocesses, a diocesan synod is a special kind of meeting called by the diocesan bishop that brings together a large group of people from varied backgrounds to discuss the pastoral ministry of a diocese. Its purpose is to propose standards to the diocesan bishop for setting the direction of the pastoral ministry in the diocese for years to come. From this, a further question may be raised: Why a Diocesan Synod? Did we not already have the Plenary Council which was preceded by local plenary discussions? According to the Canon Law, a diocesan bishop may call a Diocesan Synod if he feels there is a particular pastoral need or particular circumstances suggest to him that it is necessary to do so. For Bishop Vincent, the particular circumstances justifying the convocation of a Diocesan Synod are a) the Plenary Council; and b) the completion of the Diocesan Pastoral Plan called "Faith in our Future 2014-2018". Hence, the Diocesan Synod is a direct outcome of the Plenary Council decreeing that each diocese is to hold a diocesan synod. Moreover, the diocese also needs a new Diocesan Pastoral Plan for the future.

I have also noticed not only the symptom of "Plenary / Synod Fatigue". There were Synod Masses, Synod trainings, Synod consultations, more Synod consultations, and Synod reports. It ended up with a wealth of valuable information, but also in many cases, a lack of energy for anything else other than this Synod, sometimes even a lack of energy for the Synod itself. Furthermore, parishioners are also concerned about whether a diocesan synod can change the teaching of the Church.

I would like to clarify: A diocesan synod does not have the authority to address any issues related to Church doctrine. It is a consultative body that meets to discuss pastoral proposals (spiritual and catechetical formation, evangelization, etc.) to implement in a diocese so that the gospel can be proclaimed and lived by all the faithful of the diocese. Hence, a Diocesan Synod is not a place for exercising "doctrinal *democracy*". A diocesan synod does not have the power to make new laws or rules. Such authority remains with the diocesan bishop at the synod to formally establish any binding rules or laws in a diocese. The synod body only provides discussion and a consultative vote to the diocesan bishop for his consideration.

In this regard, Bishop Vincent is inviting us to "walk with him to discern further a framework by which we can revitalise our Church in the Diocese and discover together a path of renewal for all of us." So, in the case of our Diocese of Parramatta, a Diocesan Synod is exploring and identifying *pastoral-practical* issues that greatly matter for our Diocese. Hence, a Diocesan Synod is an important instrument of renewal.
