### FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Dear Friends,

This weekend we celebrate the gift our mothers. It was Anna Jarvis who fought so hard for the "Mother's Day" until 1910 when this day was celebrated with special services held in Sydney at which white carnations

became a symbol of Mother's Day. Carnations are a species of flowering plants. They come from the Dianthus genus and are members of the Caryophyllaceae family. Carnations are some of the oldest (if not the oldest) flowers to be cultivated. Carnations come in a variety of colors. Each colour of carnations has different symbolic meaning. In general, carnations are known to represent the following: Love, Devotion, Fascination or Captivation and Distinction. These characters truly represent the gift of our mothers. So let us bless our mothers with this

prayer: "Good and Gentle God, we pray in gratitude for our mothers and for all the women who have joined with you in the wonder of bringing forth new life. You who became human through a woman, grant to all mothers the courage they need to face the uncertain future that life with children always brings."

The Church is also symbolically called mother. However, her young children are increasingly leaving the mother-Church. A recent survey shows that only 6% of young Catholics regularly attend the parish Sunday Mass. From this we can conclude that the mother-Church may be without grand children in the future since the mother-Church is no longer a priority of young parents. Yet St Finbar's may defy the trend as we are so blessed with so many young families who are committed and live by their Catholic faith and its values. To strengthen the Faith of our young people, St Finbar's and the Diocesan Mission Enhancement Team have embarked on a collaboration to attract and to invite young Catholics to celebrate their Catholic heritage and faith. Last Sunday, we had a magnificent celebration of faith when around 60 young Catholics came together for a FAITH FEED PARTY in the parish hall with Steve Baird as the main speaker. It was so wonderful to share the experience of the joy of the Faith, but also to listen to critical questions of young people. I would like to thank the Diocesan MET, Claire and Jackson Brown, Nicole Young, the Parish Youth Team, Steve Baird and Natalie and Steve Darby for their wonderful contribution to the success of the event.
