Exodus 19:2-6; Ps 99; Romans 5:6-11; Matthew 9:36-10:8

FR JOE'S MUSINGS

"Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned."

This Sunday's gospel of Matthew summarises very well the central message of Jesus: He was moved with pity for his disciples who appeared to be disorientated since they were deprived of a Shepherd. The Greek bible uses *Esplagchnisthe* to describe Jesus inner emotion: Esplagchnisthe is unique to the New Testament, and it is only found in the gospels. Most important of all, Jesus is the only subject of this verb. The use of esplagehnisthe by the gospel writers tells us that, in Christ, something new was happening in God's relationship to the human race. Through Christ, God shares our sufferings so completely that we don't even have good language for it. It isn't enough to say that God has mercy for us. Through Christ, God's compassion has become a verb. God "compassions" us. Our sufferings have become God's sufferings. In Christ, God has entered fully into all human misery, exercising a level of inclusive nearness that forever deepens God's relationship with humanity. God is Spirit, but in Christ, God experienced "the bowels of deep feeling" for the human race. That might seem too crude or earthy a way to speak of Almighty God, but Incarnation (or "en-flesh-ment") is all about earthiness. It's about God being "enfleshed" in Christ, right down to the bowels of the human experience. This is what I call the "radical compassion of Christ." In this Sunday's gospel Jesus appointed and sent shepherds (Twelve Apostles) into the vineyard. Of course, the chief shepherd is Jesus who led by example of the Cross: That's what it means to be compassionate. In fact Jesus is the extraordinary, unmatchable example of compassion

because St. Paul tells us in writing to the Corinthians "Though he was God, he emptied himself, entered into our human history, became one like us in every way, gave himself over to suffering and even ignominious death on the cross." Jesus became one like us so he could enter into all of our experiences, feelings, difficulties, joys and hopes. Working in the vineyard may be tiresome. The disciples were tired, Jesus was tired. They'd been preaching and healing and meeting people one after the other for many, many days. No time for rest and quietness. Because of his compassion he was willing to reach out and listen, heal, nurture and strengthen. When we do that with one another, starting in our homes, our neighbourhoods, our country, and throughout the world, then barriers of hatred and separation will be broken down. There's reconciliation. There's peace because of compassion -- Jesus becoming one like us in every way except sin and entering into our experience, becoming one with us. Of course, as his followers, this is the virtue that is so important in our lives -- in everyday life, in our families, and our homes -- to really be understanding of one another, to listen, to take in what the other is feeling. It unites us in a bond of compassion that becomes love. That could happen in our communities if we really worked at it.




