PARISH INFORMATION

Did you get it?

"Even many homilies — I say it with respect but with pain — are abstract, and instead of awakening the soul, they put it to sleep. When the faithful start looking at their watches (and say), 'When is this going to end?', they put the soul to sleep," the Pope said January 24 during his Sunday Angelus address.

This Sunday's gospel depicts Jesus as a preacher who used parables to teach his disciples. His parables were short, ranging from a single verse (Matt. 13:33) to a couple of dozen (Luke 15:11-32). They all used everyday examples and were relatable stories to those who heard them, and they had a truth that Jesus was attempting to get across to those he was teaching. On the surface, the parable was just an interesting story, one that was easily understood by the listeners and based on things within their own experience. But the parable also had a deeper meaning, illustrating a spiritual truth. In Jesus' use of parables, this truth mostly dealt with the kingdom of heaven but it was a truth that was easy to miss.

How to sow?

The parable of the "Sower" is also recorded in Mark 4:3-8 and Luke 8:5-8. In this parable the Sower sows the same type of seeds, but as he scatters his seeds, they fall on four different types of ground. There are four different results based upon the four different types of ground that the seeds fell on. The four different types of ground are: 1.) beside the road; 2.) the rocky places, where they did not have much soil; 3.) among the thorns; and 4.) the good soil.

In a predominantly agricultural society like Judea, Jesus's audience would have been familiar with all of these actions and outcomes.

The most important teaching I would like to draw your intention to is verse 22. There, Jesus says that the thorns represent "the cares of this age and the deceitfulness of riches (which) choke the word, (so that) he becomes unfruitful."

This Sower knows all that, but sows his seeds widely anyway–just as God broadcasts mercy widely. This is a story of God's prodigality ("prodigal" has to do with lavish or wasteful expenditure). The seed that fell along the road produced nothing. The seed that fell on the rocky ground started to produce, but then stopped. The seed that fell among the thorns sprang up but was soon choked out. None of these three turned out to be of any value to the farmer. We need not despair if the results are not immediately apparent—or if some of our efforts produce no gain. *continued on p3*

In verse 8, finally, it says that the harvest will be abundant once it has found a good soil: "Others fell on good soil, and yielded fruit: some one hundred times as much, some sixty, and some thirty." In his book, *The Parables of Jesus*, Joachim Jeremias claims that a first-century harvest would have been seven-fold to ten-fold. Thirty-fold would have been very bountiful, and a hundred-fold truly amazing. Jesus' words about the harvest then, seem designed to encourage disciples who work hard with few apparent results. The parable assures us that God is at work below the surface, causing growth that will manifest itself in due time.

So the church is prodigal too, proclaiming the Gospel among primitive tribes in far-away jungles and teenage gangs in urban ghettos. In some cases, the Sower is martyred. In some cases, the Sower spends a lifetime on the mission field without seeing substantial response. In some cases, the preacher toils for hours preparing a sermon for only ten or twelve people. Jesus assures us that we need not worry that our effort is in vain. Things are happening that we cannot see. Not only is the seed at work under the surface of the ground, but God is also at work. God will bring forth the harvest, and it will be abundant.
