FR JOE'S MUSINGS

17th Sunday, Year A, 30th July 2023 Matthew 13:44-52 Give up and Sell your burden to regain Christ's joy

I can't remember exactly, but I've read this quote somewhere: "Better foolish and honest than clever and false." It appears that the author of the quote had a bad opinion about cleverness since he related it to falsity.

In this Sunday's gospel, Matthew's view on cleverness is positive as he regarded it as one way of funding the Kingdom of God.

The parable of the "treasure in the field" tells of a person who was quite clever, perhaps even sophisticated. He finds a treasure but does not tell the rightful owner about it. Rather, he acquires the property at market price. He conceals the crucial fact that he also acquires the treasure with the property.

It is the same sophistication in money matters that Jesus often describes, and which must have fascinated him in some way as a model of worldly prudence (see Mt 25: the parable of the steward who creatively multiplies the returns for the owner). Is Jesus simply interested in unrestrained enrichment here? Was Jesus a capitalist, one could ask further?

According to Matthew, Jesus does not evaluate this, but only says that this kind of understanding should now be transferred to the really important area - the gaining of eternal life with God. This kind of sophistication is something that Jesus formally admires because it testifies to imagination and commitment of the buyer.

Yet, the parable also points to the buyer's irrational action. He literally sells everything he has. He practices the gold digger mentality: He mounts up his tents to win only one thing. The difference to the gold diggers, however, is that he knows where the treasure is to be found.

Here we are not put off by an uncertain future. No, this man has already discovered the treasure. And, critically for Matthew's gospel is the additional information: "full of joy" the man went! We can't even imagine it. The fact that one sells everything for joy only exists in the context of divine love. The bible mentions that a man leaves father and mother for of a woman whom he wants to live with. For early Christianity, the joyful act of liberation always includes the farewell to property and family.

In the second parable of the pearl, Matthew replaces joy with beauty. Just as the pearl diver finds the pearl beautiful, so the Christian should find his/her faith beautiful and joyful.

Aren't we treasure hunters too? Because of life's many difficulties and doubts, some may have given up the faith. Some may have given up or lost it.



Why not selling or even GIVING UP this burden and doubts to regain the joy and beauty of life that we find in Christ?

Perhaps, let us recall Paul's struggle and his search for the Kingdom. In Philippians 3:7-8 he wrote, 'Whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ."

In the parable the man sells everything he has so that he can have the kingdom. In Philippians 3:8, Paul suffers the loss of all things that he may gain Christ.

The point of selling everything in this parable is simply to show where your heart is. "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). And if your heart is to have the kingdom above all things, then Luke 12:32 comes true for you: "It is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom."
